

Five Timber Tracts Sold at Oral Auction

Five tracts of timber, totalling 20,844,000 board feet, were sold by the Medford office of the bureau of land management at an oral auction for a total purchase price of \$553,994.50.

The first tract, containing an estimated 15,000 board feet of Douglas fir in the Sykes Creek burn area received no bids.

Second and Ready Lumber company of Cave Junction purchased an estimated 1,960,000 board feet located on Crooks Creek in southern Josephine county. Their bid for Douglas fir, the major species, was \$25.40 per thousand.

Submit High Bid Superior Lumber company of Glendale submitted a high bid of \$40.60 for Douglas fir, the major species on a tract containing an estimated 4,067,000 board feet. The timber is near

the Daisy Mine road in north-eastern Josephine county.

S. H. & W. Lumber company of Grants Pass purchased the third Josephine county tract with a high bid of \$30.55 for Douglas fir. The tract, containing an estimated 1,809,000 board feet located in West Fork Williams creek area, consisted primarily of salvage blow-down timber.

The first Jackson county tract consisted of an estimated 4,087,000 board feet of timber located in the Sykes Creek fire area. It was purchased by Barrett and company of Grants Pass for \$25.85 per thousand Douglas fir.

The last sale was purchased by Medford Corporation of Medford with a bid of \$23.50 per

thousand for Douglas fir. Their bid for white fir, which accounted for more than one-fourth the volume on this sale, was \$8.40 per thousand. The tract contained an estimated 8,921,000 board feet located between Butte Falls and Prospect.

In the minor species, prices ranged from \$29.25 to \$31.65 per thousand for ponderosa pine; from \$29.40 to \$45.55 for sugar

pine; from \$5.90 to \$11.35 for incense cedar; and from \$8.40 to \$13.85 for white fir. Western hemlock sold for \$5.90 per thousand and Port Orford cedar for \$30.55 on the single sales including those species.

The tract that received no bids will remain open for receipt of bids for a period of 90 days unless information indicates that it is desirable to reappraise the timber, in which case it will be re-advertised. Information regarding this tract may be secured at the office of the district forester in the Medford city hall.

TWA Airplanes Searched for Bomb

Los Angeles—(UPI)—A New York-bound Trans World airliner was called back Thursday night and seven other TWA planes searched at International and Burbank airports after an anonymous telephone threat that there was a bomb on one of the planes.

The FBI, police and sheriff's officers searched the planes but didn't locate any explosives. The airliners were allowed to take off for their destinations following the search.

"There's a bomb on a TWA plane," a nasal-voiced man told switchboard operators at TWA's downtown office and at International Airport. "It will never reach New York."

The plane which was flying 20 minutes out of Los Angeles en route to New York was ordered back immediately after the call was received. Nearly 200 persons were delayed while officers searched the planes and luggage for a bomb.

Another TWA airliner en route from San Francisco to New York Thursday was ordered to land at Phoenix after police there received a similar call about a bomb planted aboard the plane. The call was labeled another hoax after officers searched the plane without finding a bomb.



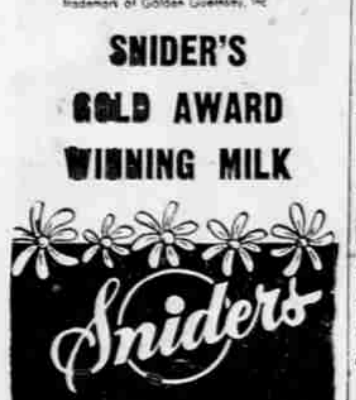
