Talent-Medford Churches to Hear College Choir

The Friends churches of Medford and Talent will be hosts to the 32-voice cappella choir of George Fox college this weekend, when they will appear in sacred concerts at the Talent church Saturday at 7:30 p.m., and at the Medford church Sunday at both the 9:45 and 11 a.m. worship hours.

According to Ross Stover, conductor, the four sections of the choir program offer a variety of sacred music, including contemporary American anthems, 16th century and Russian church music, and folk songs of the south.
