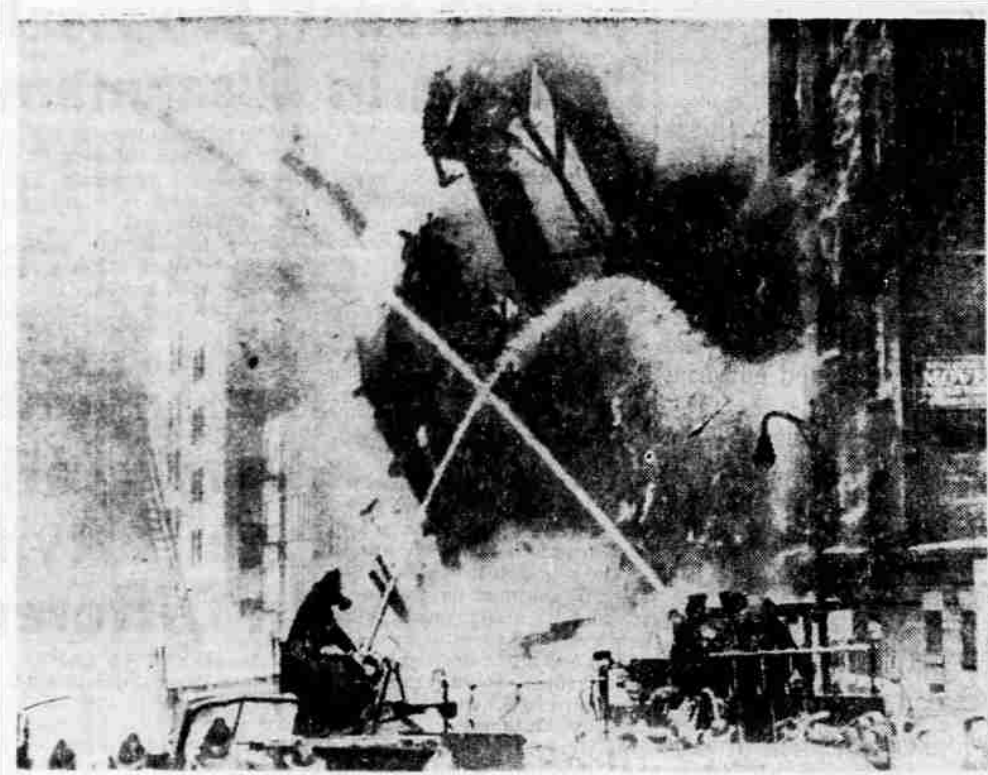

Car Without Brakes Kills Three People

Miami, Fla. — (U.P.) — A car traveling about 70 miles per hour despite having "no brakes whatsoever" swerved from a highway south of here Sunday night and struck and killed a young couple and their infant son.

The dead were Tommy David Ashley, 22, a packing house laborer, his wife Jane, 18, and their 10-month-old son David.

State highway patrolmen within 15 minutes after the incident captured Eddie Floyd Brewer, 27-year-old farm laborer listed as driver of the car, and his companion, William H. Mason, 28, who had fled the scene together on foot.

They were held on manslaughter charges. Both men had been drinking, patrolmen said. IN A BIG WAY: Indianapolis, Ind. — (U.P.) — Gov. Harold Handley blamed a \$32 million tax error in his state budget on his Irish ancestry.

Higher Interest Rate On Saving Bonds Seen

Washington — (U.P.) — The House called up for almost certain passage today a bill to raise the interest rate on government savings bonds.

The measure would allow the Treasury to carry out its announced plan of boosting the interest of series "E" and "H" bonds from the present 3 percent interest to 3 1/4 percent.

Actually, the measure authorizes an increase to 3 1/2 percent. But the Treasury has announced it will raise the rate to only 3 1/4 percent.

Treasury officials said a higher interest rate was necessary to make the bonds more attractive to investors who have been shunning them in favor of other more attractive investments.
