Nation To Undergo Hypothetical Attack

Washington — (U.P.) — The nation will undergo a hypothetical attack from nuclear bombs of from 20 kilotons to 20 megatons in the fourth annual "Operation Alert" in July.

The Civil Defense administration announced Tuesday the program will be held in three stages this year and will be somewhat altered. Government agencies will not move to relocation sites as they have in the past. And the nature and extent of the simulated attack or the cities involved will not be published in advance.

Three phases of the exercises this year will be:
July 8-12: Rehearsal by local and state civil defense directors and the public in evacuation plans and other readiness activities.
July 12-14: Assumed nuclear attacks on U. S. cities.
July 15-19: Survival action period.

New Jersey Factory Explosion Kills Three

Linden, N. J. — (U.P.) — Three men were killed and seven injured today when an explosion destroyed a three-story building at the Merck and Co. pharmaceutical plant.

The dead were identified tentatively as Walter Green of Rahway, and Edward Mnich and Edward Cendrowski of Linden. All were inside the plant when the blast occurred in a 500-gallon still.

One of the injured, Leo Zitch of Rahway, was taken to Rahway hospital. The other six were treated at the plant dispensary.

Cause of the explosion was unknown but a company spokesman said it appeared to have been an "unexplained chemical reaction."
