# Tar Heels, Jayhawks Favorites In NCAA Hoop Semi-Final Tilts

Kansas City, Mo.—(U.P.)—North Carolina's No. 1 rated Tar Heels and the University of Kansas today were installed as favorites by oddsmakers in the NCAA basketball championship semi-finals scheduled tonight at Municipal auditorium.

The local odds were that North Carolina would top Michigan State by five points in the first game beginning at 5:30 (PST) and that Kansas, the No. 2 rated team, would beat San Francisco by nine points in the second game starting at 7:30 (PST).

Should North Carolina and Kansas meet in the national championship Saturday night, the local oddsmakers favored Kansas by two points.

Competing Teams Arrive  
The four teams participating in the championships, rated perhaps as the finest four teams ever to enter the finals, arrived here Thursday and held workouts at the auditorium.

To offset a ticket squeeze, officials announced that tonight's first game would be telecast in North Carolina and possibly Michigan. The championship game Saturday night is to be telecast regionally, and possibly to other areas of the nation if local TV stations decide to join the hookup.

All four coaches pronounced their teams raring to go and Fordy Anderson of Michigan State said in so many words that his team, "the finest I've ever coached," was going to win the championship.

Dick Harp of Kansas heard the words, and those of the other coaches, and kept on saying, "Somebody has to face Will Chamberlain before they win the championship."

The chore of facing the seven-foot Chamberlain, the most talked about player in town, first goes to San Francisco and Coach Phil Woolpert said he still hadn't devised any special defense. He said he would play a man-to-man with either 6-9 Art Day or 6-7 Mike Farmer drawing the Chamberlain assignment.

Tar Heels Ready  
Frank McGuire of North Carolina said his boys "are relaxed and ready to win these final two games." McGuire said the Tar Heels "will play exactly the opposite offense of Michigan State." Since Michigan State plays only one brand of ball, the fast break, it appeared that North Carolina would try to slow it down.

The battle between San Francisco and Kansas settled down to which would control tempo of the game. San Francisco likes to slow it down with defensive strategy. Harp doesn't especially care what type of a game is played, as long as Kansas controls the tempo. Kansas' two losses this season came when Iowa State and Oklahoma A&M were able to set the pattern of play.

# Memphis To Take On Bradley in NIT Final

New York — (U.P.) — So now this upset-happy National Invitation Basketball tourney comes to a showdown between Bradley, a team that's "tearin' the joint apart," and Memphis State, a dashing dark-horse that has surprised three straight times.

That's the hard-to-pick lineup for Saturday's nationally-televised finale at 2 p.m. EST in Madison Square Garden—a pairing produced by eight upsets out of 10 preliminary games.

Bradley became only the second favorite to win a game in the whole carnival Thursday night when it romped to a 94-66 victory over Temple in a semi-final. In the other, Bob Swander's one-hander with three seconds left in overtime gave Memphis State a 80-78 decision over St. Bonaventure in the tourney's most exciting game to date.

Another Shot  
"I kind of like Bradley in the final," said defeated Coach Harry Litwack of Temple, and it appeared that the hot-shooting Braves from Peoria, Ill., will be favored over the Tennessee Tigers by game time.

That means that Bradley will be getting another shot at the title it narrowly missed in 1950, when it was beaten by CCNY's "double champions" in the final, 69-61—the same year it lost to the same team in the NCAA final.

It also means that Memphis State gets an amazing chance to grab the gold ring on its first ride on the merry-go-round, its first appearance in the NIT.

And oddly enough, the final matches the team coached this year by Bob Vanatta Memphis State, with the team he coached last year—a situation unprecedented in a major tournament.
