Tucker's Town, Bermuda — President Eisenhower and British Prime Minister Harold Macmillan, discussing nuclear tests in a communique issued at the end of their Bermuda conference:

"We would be willing to register with the United Nations advance notice of our intention to conduct future nuclear tests and to permit limited international observation of such tests if the Soviet Union would do the same."

Chicago — Victor Reuther, United Auto Workers director of international affairs, calling on the United States to urge the United Nations along itself with a regional approach to Middle East problems:

"We should focus on the common hopes of Israel and the Arabian countries rather than on their common fears."

New York — Robert Briscoe, the first Jewish lord mayor of Dublin, on the Irish Republican army's warfare along the northern border:

"I disagree entirely with this particular movement. These raids will not secure anything but hardship."

Tokyo — A U.S. Air Force spokesman, on the search for a C-97 military transport plane that vanished over the Pacific Friday with 67 Americans aboard:

"We found a few things, but they all turned out to be debris not connected with the plane."

## Three Legislators Forming Fund Club

Salem — (U.P.) — Three Republican state legislators are organizing a state-wide campaign to establish a fund to help educate the children of police officers killed in line of duty.

The three — Ed Cone of Eugene, Wayne Giesy of Monroe and Sam Wilderman of Portland — said they will name the organization the "Line of Duty club." They hope to get all backers of the House bill to abolish capital punishment in Oregon to join the new club.

Wilderman said all three legislators are supporting the bill but that so far no one has come forward with any plan to "do something for the children of the police officers who are killed while performing their duty."

"We want this organization to focus attention on the unfortunate wife and children of a police officer killed in line of duty rather than on the fellow who pulled the trigger," Giesy said.

**Japan Appeals for Nuclear Tests Ban**
