The Medical Roundup

Pheochromocytoma
 Usually I do not discuss in this column the rarer diseases, because so few of my readers have cause to be interested. But, occasionally, when I describe a rare disease dozens of persons later write to tell me that at last, after a most futile

doctoring, they have come to see what was wrong. They realized that they could not blame their physicians for having failed to diagnose the disease because the doctors had never seen a case, and had never read much about it.

There is a rare disease, due to a little tumor growing in an adrenal gland, situated just above a kidney. It is called a pheochromocytoma, or a cellular tumor that stains a dark color with chromic acid. I personally can remember having seen only one case, that of a middle-aged woman who began to sweat so terribly, especially at night, that she had to sleep on two or three bath towels. She saw several physicians who could only guess that it was an exaggerated menopausal reaction, but treatment for the menopause did not help.

Klamath Compact Action Delayed by House Re-Referral

Salem—(U.P.)—Final action on the proposed Klamath Basin compact was delayed at least a week Monday when the compact was unanimously re-referred by the House to the Committee on Judiciary.

Lawyer members of the House objected to the Oregon-California water agreement because of legal technicalities. They also said the policy question of whether commission members should be exempt from liability should be settled in committee.

Rep. Robert A. Bennett, Grants Pass Republican, said he favored the compact but thought members of the proposed commission should be liable for wrongdoing and able to be sued.

Passed by Senate

The compact has passed both the Oregon and California Senates.

Rep. John Kerbow, Klamath Falls Democrat, said that the California House was awaiting action by the Oregon House before voting on the measure. He said there should be time to work out suitable amendments and still give the California house time to act.

No opposition was voiced as to the principles, or need for the compact and members of the judiciary committee indicated they would act rapidly in working out amendments.

If approved by both state legislatures, the compact will be sent to Congress for final approval. It would set up priorities for use of all water in the Klamath basin for the two states.

Five Local Students Get Scholarships

Five Medford and Central Point students now attending Linfield college, Me. in Maine, are among approximately 200 included in a \$50,000 scholarship and student aid program during the current college year.

Local students receiving the scholarships are Kay Kelly, Howard Morris, Jim Crawford and Mel Harsh, Crater High school graduates, and Billie Conner, Medford High school graduate.

Some of the awards are given for scholarship, some for excellence in particular fields and some are grants in aid. They range from the large, \$800 to \$480, which are four-year scholarships for freshmen, to the \$60 one-semester and one-year grants.
