## Jury Says Death of Central Point Man Is Suicide

The death Wednesday of Bud Morris Smith, 70, of 923 Manzanita st., Central Point, resulted from a self-inflicted gunshot wound, a coroner's jury declared Saturday morning.  
The jury's verdict was returned after 15 witnesses testified at an inquest held at 8:30 a.m. Saturday, in Central Point.
