Arabian Gaspipe Gun Worthless as Weapon

Arab gaspipe guns and pistols have never seemed to me as worth anything other than the value of precious metals they may have, as strictly curios.

But that, I am finally convinced, is wrong. Though utterly worthless as weapons—at least, all those I have even seen—they do command a rather surprising value as collector's items.

Whether this is due to an increasing awareness of things Arabia which the world is now experiencing, I am not prepared to say. All I know is it exists.

I became aware of it recently when I turned down a gaspipe pistol only to see a more valuable conscious friend buy it and resell it at a substantial profit within hours.

The pistol was a smoothbore, with an 11-inch, round barrel, slightly bell-mouthed and with a wooden stock reaching almost its entire length. It was bound by four brass bands.

It had a brass butt cap, pan, trigger guard and lockplates. There also was a brass tip on the swivel rammer, too.

And much of the brass was engraved with Arabic characters. On the lockplate, in Arabic numerals naturally, was the date 1811. But that was the only thing readable I could find to indicate the origin of the piece.

The price the owner wanted was \$20. I thought it ridiculous. There was no silver, gold or ivory on the weapon.

But that didn't bother my friend who willingly paid the \$20. Later that same day he sold it to an arms dealer for \$35, and who in turn said he had a customer waiting and willing to pay \$60 for it.

They turned out to be an antique dealer friend of hers. The friend recognized them as good examples of a design popular from the 1860s to the 1880s. It is easy to tell in the plates by their having a six-pointed star in the center.

Both the star and the broad rim of the plate are studded with small "hobnail" or "dewdrop" forms. Usually they are in clear glass, or blue or yellow or amber. Joan continued, "and those are worth about \$10 a plate. But these are worth probably twice that much."
