

Course in Photography Starts For Medford Police Department

A course in photography has been started for Medford police officers in connection with the department's current training program which includes a refresher course on first aid, court procedures and firearm training, according to Chief Charles Champlin.

Champlin said the photography course is training officers to take pictures of prisoners and photograph crime and accident scenes. The course is intended to place two or three trained men on each of the three platoons, he said.

Courses to Continue

The series of courses, which started recently, will continue over a period of several months.

Sgt. Raymond V. Seely is instructor of the course.

Taking the course are Capt. Clyde Fichtner, Lt. Jack MacMillan, Lt. Rollie Pean, Lt. Lyle Perkins, Lt. Orlo McGee, Sgt. Leo Mitchell, Sgt. Keith Gildesgard, and Officers Jack Sanders and DeLaire Susow, Champlin said.

The chief added that 14 members of the department, including himself, had recently completed refresher first aid courses and received advanced first aid cards, which must be renewed every three years. Instructor for the courses was Captain Fichtner.

Receiving cards were Chief Champlin, Lieutenants Perkins, MacMillan, Pean and McGee;

Sergeants Seely, Gildesgard and Mitchell; and Officers Elroy P. Erickson, Robert F. James, Berie E. Stevens, Ted H. Whistler, Robert Allen and Tusow.

A recent feature of the training program has been instructions from several Medford attorneys on court and legal procedures. Municipal Judge Noreen Kelly, Edward Kelly and William Deatherage, Medford attorneys, were speakers at a departmental meeting last week. Miss Kelly discussed municipal court procedures. Deatherage spoke on court procedures pertaining to misdemeanors and felonies and Kelly discussed the laws and rules of evidence and examination of witnesses.

Champlin said on April 9 and 10, Harold G. Brack, special agent of the FBI, Portland, will conduct a firearm training course at the National Guard range near Camp White. He will hold instructions on the use of the riot gun and the .38 caliber pistol, the chief said.

Champlin noted that the majority of the officers participating in the department's training program were using their own time.

Plane Catches Fire; Two Escape Injury

Portland — (U.P.) — Two Seattle officers escaped injury Sunday when a Navy divebomber on a routine flight caught fire when its landing gear collapsed while landing here.

Aboard were Cmdr. W. A. Townsend and Marine Lt. Col. K. L. Russer. A belly gasoline tank caught fire when the AD-3 plane crashed on the runway.

Bomber Off Course At Time of Crash

Honolulu — (U.P.) — The Air Force said Monday that a B47 Stratojet bomber was "miles off course" when it slammed into a mountain ridge and exploded, killing four men.

The Strategic Air Command bomber burst into a flaming ball and disintegrated Sunday 50 feet from the top of 2600 foot Mount Kaala as it was entering the final approach to Hickam Air Force base on a flight from Guam.

An Air Force spokesman said

the \$2,000,000 bomber "was making about 300 miles per hour" when it hit the rugged mountain just minutes after passing over a populated area.

The plane was assigned to the 339th Bomb Squadron of the 96th Bomb Wing at Altus, Okla.

Robert James Bekker, 19, Star Route, box 155, Prospect, was cited for following too close when the sport car he was operating struck a vehicle operated by Jean Elizabeth Bonney, 16, of 681 Crater Lake highway.

State police said the accident occurred Sunday morning at the intersection of Agate rd., and Highway 62.

From Rear

According to officers, Miss Bonney had reduced the speed of

her car after a vehicle in front of her stopped to make a turn. Bekker approached from the rear and attempted to pass Miss Bonney's car, but hit the left rear of her vehicle.

A car operated by Peggy D. Walls, 17, route 1, box 140, Talent, struck a jeep pick-up which was parked at 2194 Huston rd. at 2:45 p.m., Sunday, police reported. The jeep was registered to Omer A. Retter, 4202 South Pacific highway.

Sir Eden Begins Series of Tests

Boston — (U.P.) — Sir Anthony Eden began a series of medical tests today in a new attempt to heal the abdominal ailment which forced an end to his political career three months ago.

The former British prime minister arrived by plane Sunday from New Zealand. His post-treatment vacation there had been cut short by recurrence of fevers apparently caused by a digestive ailment for which he has twice undergone surgery.

The long-time crown prince of Britain's Conservative Party, now 59, slept throughout most of the last leg—from Vancouver, B.C.—of his 10,000 mile flight. A heavy tan belied his illness, but Eden, for many years the very model of a proper British diplomat, faltered slightly as he left his car at New England Baptist Hospital, and his attempted smile was weak.

Lahey Clinic surgeon Dr. Richard B. Cattell, who operated on Eden for a bile duct obstruction in June 1953, said his patient seemed "comfortable" and was "in no pain." He was ordered to bed immediately to rest for the medical tests.

San Francisco Bay Area Feels Two Minor Quakes

San Francisco Bay Area felt two minor tremors Sunday with University of California seismologists said were aftershocks of the March 22 earthquake.

The first was recorded at 8:20 a.m. and had a Richter magnitude of 2.3, one of the strongest quakes since March 27. The other occurred at 4:18 p.m. and registered 2 1/2 on the scale.
