Queen in Last Day Of Visit To France

Paris—(U.P.)—Queen Elizabeth II began the last day of her three-day state visit Wednesday by attending a formal reception at the British Embassy to meet the carefully selected upper crust of the British colony living in Paris.

The embassy reception was the first event of the busy day. The Queen meets American Gen. Lauris Norstad, supreme allied commander in Europe, at Norstad's Marnes La Coquette home. Norstad vigorously opposes Britain's cut in its contributions to NATO defense forces. Queen Elizabeth talked briefly with German Gen. Hans Speidel, new commander of NATO ground forces, at a British Embassy reception Tuesday night.

The reception followed a five-mile boat ride along the Seine river, which had been turned into a spotlighted fairland of pageantry.

Police estimated half a million Parisians and tourists jammed every bridge and quay from the Invalides to the Ile St. Louis. A rolling thunder of cheers followed the presidential

yacht *Borde Fretigny* on its 20-minute journey. Along the quays platoons of actors and singers depicted the history of France, much of it having to do with wars against Britain.

Tests To Determine Cause of Eden Fever

Boston—(U.P.)—Sir Anthony Eden was given new laboratory tests today by Lahey clinic physicians in an attempt to learn the cause of persistent fever attacks which have endangered his health.

Dr. Richard B. Cattell, Lahey surgeon who operated on Eden in 1933, said Tuesday that he was in "no pain." He said "several days" of tests will be necessary to diagnose the intestinal illness which forced Eden to cut short a New Zealand vacation.

The New England Baptist hospital reported that the 59-year-old former British prime minister "is active and up and about in his room and has tolerated the diet well."

Guilt in Murder Ruled by Bronx Jury

New York—(U.P.)—A Bronx County Court jury found Vincent Spano, 27, guilty of first degree murder Tuesday night for the slaying of former welter-weight boxer Frankie Palermo. The 11-man, one-woman jury deliberated for more than eight hours before returning their verdict with a recommendation for mercy. Such a verdict automatically calls for execution in the electric chair at Sing Sing prison.

Judge Eugene C. Schulz set May 9 for sentencing. Spano, a machinist, fatally shot Palermo last Jan. 22 after a fist fight in a Bronx candy store.

He showed no emotion when the verdict was announced.

Two Private Planes Collide in Mid-Air

Fort Worth, Tex.—(U.P.)—Two private planes, with an instructor and student aboard each, collided in flight Tuesday, raining wreckage over a quarter-mile area. All four were killed.

Both planes, Cessna 140s, were from Meecham Field here. One plane was on instruments. A pilot in the area said later he heard a voice on the radio say, "there's a Cessna in your flight path."

John Lewis Senn, 38, and his student, Clarence Paul Chambers, 25, were in one plane and John Kenneth Shultetus, an instructor and Lloyd Darrell Rutledge were in the other. Their bodies were charred beyond recognition.
