## The Medical Roundup

**A Health Exposition**

A few weeks ago I was one of the speakers at a remarkable Health Exposition held in Cincinnati. It was built up by the Academy of Medicine to show the tremendous advances that have been made in medicine in the last hundred years. In a few days, over a quarter of a million people saw the exhibits and attended lectures. They were fascinated by Juno, the woman with a transparent plastic body. One organ after another, from the brain down to the bladder and the blood vessels in the legs, would light up. The exhibit that had the biggest crowd was the one showing the development of a child from the ovum to birth. The queue leading to this exhibit was so long that it took a person 45 minutes to pass through it.

An interesting exhibit showed the great changes that have taken place in the doctor's bag. There were the saddle-bags such as my father carried about with him 70 years ago. They contained a few drugs, a case of small instruments for minor surgery, such as the lancing of boils or abscesses, and some forceps for the removal of aching teeth. Today the doctor would need several bags to carry around with him the great number of new drugs and appliances which he needs as he sees his patients.

The doctor of 1857 had only a few drugs and most of them were of little, if any, value. He had nothing that would stop the fever of a serious infection like pneumonia or typhoid fever. About the only pain-killer he had was opium. He hadn't heard yet of aspirin, and there were no antibiotics, vitamins, tranquilizers, sleep-makers, or anti-histamines. Often, in those days, because the doctor didn't know of anything else to do, he would bleed his patient. Today, we know that this was a bad practice. Naturally, very few operations were being done in 1857.
