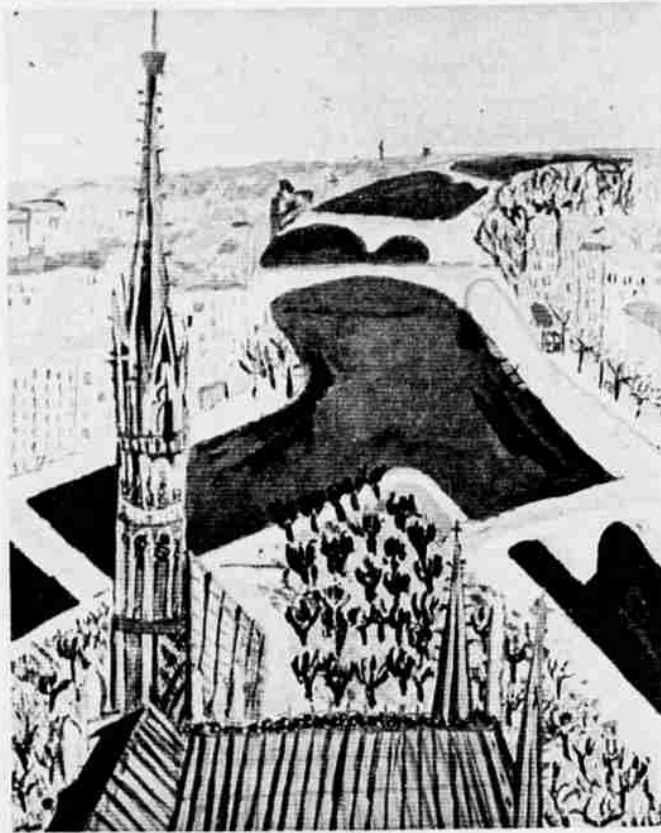

Wee French Artists Are Realists

THINK OF A French painting and your mind's eye may picture a wildly abstract canvas on which you can't tell a rose from a rhinoceros!

But French artists don't start out that way. As proved in a traveling exhibit of paintings by pupils in French public schools, their early days are devoted to drawing things precisely as they look to the camera; their strict assignment is to "reflect nature."

"Here in the United States, painters are abstract in the beginning," says a member of the French Embassy. "In France, they first must learn to draw by the classical system." Art instruction begins in nursery school, where pupils are as young as two. Some 600 works by pupils at Parisian public schools are to be shown in 35 states between now and December. The budding artists range in age from 8 to 17.
