## PRESIDENTS ALL

ANDREW JACKSON faced his own stable of horses while he was President, but no other Chief Executive has attended a horse race in the past 75 years.

Only two Presidents were born in large cities—Theodore Roosevelt, in New York City, and William Howard Taft, Cincinnati. President Eisenhower is the only Texas-born Chief Executive.

Our tallest President was Abraham Lincoln at 6 feet, 4 inches; the shortest was James Madison, who measured only 5 feet, 4 inches.

When James Garfield ran for office, he campaigned in both English and German.

President Eisenhower was asleep within two minutes after going to bed on election night of 1952.

Warren G. Harding was a pretty good trombone player; as a member of the "Silver Cornet Band," he once won \$200 in a band contest. Other Presidents who had musical talent were Thomas Jefferson, who played



the violin; John Tyler, who had a good singing voice; and Harry Truman, who plays the piano.

William Henry Harrison, once a medical student, delivered the longest Presidential address. It lasted almost two hours.

Three Presidents—John Adams, Jefferson, and James Monroe—died on July 4. Calvin Coolidge was born on Independence Day.

When Lincoln delivered his inaugural address, four future Presidents were present—Rutherford B. Hayes, Garfield, Chester A. Arthur, and Benjamin Harrison.
