The Medical Roundup

Good Nature or Viciousness in Animals

When in this column, I remark that many a man inherits a bad and violent temper from his father or grandfather a number of people write to take me to task. But I cannot see why we human beings shouldn't at times inherit bad qualities as well as good ones. Certainly, many of us owe everything we are in life to the inheritance of good qualities. For instance, if I have a fairly good and useful brain today I think it is due to the fact that my father and mother both had unusually good brains. Almost certainly I got from my father my drive, my love of hard work, my love of science, my love of writing and teaching, and my sense of humor.

I got from my mother my love of the beautiful in nature and art, and my love of good literature. Because I got so much that was wonderfully good from her, why should I complain if I got also from her some nervousness and hypersensitiveness?

I recently read a remarkable article by Dr. John L. Fuller, of the Roscoe B. Jackson Memorial laboratory, a great center for studies in genetics. He says what every breeder of animals knows, namely, that individual differences in personality are conspicuous in dogs, horses or even white mice and rats. That these differences are largely hereditary in origin is shown by the fact that a geneticist can easily produce aggressive or non-aggressive strains of white rats by breeding appropriately. The good disposition of present-day laboratory rats is the result of the tendency biologists long have had to select for breeding, tame and non-biting animals. No one in his senses would pick up a Norway rat found under a barn; one would get badly bitten. But one need have little fear of picking up a laboratory white rat; it won't bite.

Can Develop Intelligence

Dr. Fuller goes on to say that if the experimenter wishes, he can easily develop a strain of animals that will quickly learn to negotiate a complicated maze. Selection in the opposite direction will produce a strain of animals that have great difficulty in learning to go through the maze.

If a geneticist or animal breeder has so little difficulty in breeding either a stupid or a highly intelligent stock, why shouldn't the children of two brilliant or highly intelligent people be able? They usually are. And why shouldn't children

of two feeble-minded people commonly be feeble-minded? They usually are.

An interesting point which can cheer parents of some retarded children is that the dull rats that have been bred to have trouble getting through a maze can be brought through in other ways. Similarly, in the studies made of dogs at the Jackson laboratory, no one breed has been found to be consistently superior in intelligence to all tests. There are only "patterns of abilities" which seem to be the things that are dependent on heredity.

Research on Drugs

I recently read Dr. Howard Fabing's statement that, while searching for a drug to help epileptics, Drs. Merritt and Putnam tested 700 compounds. Dilantin was the result. In my hands this drug has given wonderful results, especially in "carriers" of epilepsy—or relatives of epileptics who have no seizures, but have a violent temper, and suffer from terrible nightmares, feelings of hostility to people, feelings that often their stream of consciousness is momentarily interrupted, feelings of great fear, and a feeling of a great need for hanging onto their sanity.
