

Airport Concessions Earn \$4,276 in March

Concessions at the Medford airport earned \$4,276.36 in revenue during March, according to the monthly report of municipal activities. The total includes \$2,708.53 from building rentals and the remainder from land fees, gas and oil, tie downs, electrical service and miscellaneous concessions.

Air traffic through Medford, the report showed, totaled 5,881 planes, including 40 Air Force, nine Navy, 746 air carrier and 5,086 civil.

A total of 3,062 passengers boarded commercial aircraft in Medford and 3,038 landed here during March. Mail shipments from Medford totaled 7,819 pounds, express 981 pounds and freight 9,140 pounds. Mail shipments arriving in Medford totaled 15,084 pounds, express 2,734 pounds and freight 10,169 pounds.

Total passenger movement last month was 6,100, compared to 5,628 in February and 6,259 in March of 1956. Mail shipments totaled 22,903 pounds during March, compared to 20,858 pounds in February, and 26,580 pounds in March of 1956, according to the report.

fire department responded to 46 alarms, of which 13 were defective flues, five overheated stoves, six smoke investigations and two false alarms. The Medford rural fire district responded to 11 alarms of which four were defective flues, two defective wiring and one false alarm, the report showed.

The fire marshal reported 55 inspections last month. Twenty-nine of these were business occupancies, four were warehouses, four were hotels or motels, three were buildings of public assembly and three were convalescent homes.

The report said that 78 orders and recommendations were issued for the removal of fire hazards.

There were 400 violations handled by the municipal court during March. According to the report \$3,092.50 was collected from fines.

New Regulation Gets Approval by BLM

Final approval of a regulation requiring application to the bureau of land management for rights-of-way and permission to construct state and county roads on revested Oregon and California Railroad grant lands of western Oregon was announced today by the department of the interior.

The requirement gives the bureau authority to control the location of roads, make reasonable rules concerning construction, and charge for timber removed, damaged, or destroyed in clearing rights-of-way for road construction.

Acting Secretary Hatfield Chilson gave final approval to the new regulation when no objections were received during the waiting period allowed for public comment following its publication as proposed rule-making in the Federal Register.

Goodrich Workers Begin Return To Jobs

Cincinnati, Ohio—(U.P.)—The first of some 14,000 production and maintenance workers have returned to work at nine B. F. Goodrich Rubber Co. plants with a new contract which ended a 15-day strike.

Goodrich officials, who signed a uniform two-year agreement with the United Rubber Workers union Monday night, said operations will resume as soon as preparatory work is completed.

Plants affected by the strike are at Akron and Marion, Ohio; Los Angeles, Calif.; Miami, Okla.; Tuscaloosa, Ala.; Oaks, Pa.; Riverside, N.J.; Clarksville, Tenn., and Cadillac, Mich.

1,083 Persons X-Rayed at Clinic Thus Far This Year

A total of 1,083 x-rays have been taken since Jan. 1 at the out-patient chest x-ray clinic at Sacred Heart hospital, Mrs. Robert Paris, director of x-ray for the Jackson County Public Health association, reported today.

Of those x-rayed 151 have been referred to their doctors for conditions needing further attention, she said. These include suspicion of tuberculosis or tumors, heart conditions and other chest diseases.

The clinic is maintained by the association as part of its cases finding program with machinery purchased by Christmas seal money. A small charge is made to cover operating cost. Volunteer clerical help is provided by the Providence Guild, Mrs. Paris stated.

Chest x-rays are recognized as a quick, efficient method of discovering early tuberculosis. Mrs. Paris pointed out, and urged adults in the county to take advantage of the opportunity.

She stressed that food market employees, baby sitters, and restaurant workers should make a special point of having annual x-rays.

The clinic at Sacred Heart hospital is open to the public every Thursday from 2 to 5 p.m. and the first Wednesday of each month between 7 and 9 p.m.

\$9 Million Available In OHI Campaign

More than \$9,000,000 will be available in Oregon through banks and lending institutions for FHA and private loans in the three-month campaign sponsored by the Southern Oregon Operation Home Improvement, according to officials of the non-profit corporation.

The corporation is made up of businessmen, bankers and labor from Ashland, Medford and Grants Pass. Operation Home Improvement was instigated by President Eisenhower last year. Improvement is to improve living conditions, according to officials.

The Federal Housing authority has increased title I limits for home owners to participate in Operation Home Improvement, corporation officials said.

OHI's campaign is one of education, they said, and members advertise for themselves.
