### Migraine in Children

I'll never forget the first child I saw, some 45 years ago, a girl of 12, with severe migraine. Because I never had read of such a thing, I was greatly puzzled, and feared that since the child had abdominal pain she might have a disease. What happened was that every so often the child would be sent home from school, vomiting; she would tumble into bed, she would turn her face to the wall, and for the next 24 hours she would be completely apathetic. Her eyes would be glazed, and she would pay not the slightest attention to anything. She would not accept any food. Every so often she would retch. At the beginning of the attack the child would say that she had pain in her abdomen and some in her head.

In the course of years I saw enough of these children so that I learned they must not be operated on. There is nothing wrong in the abdomen; the whole trouble is up in the brain.

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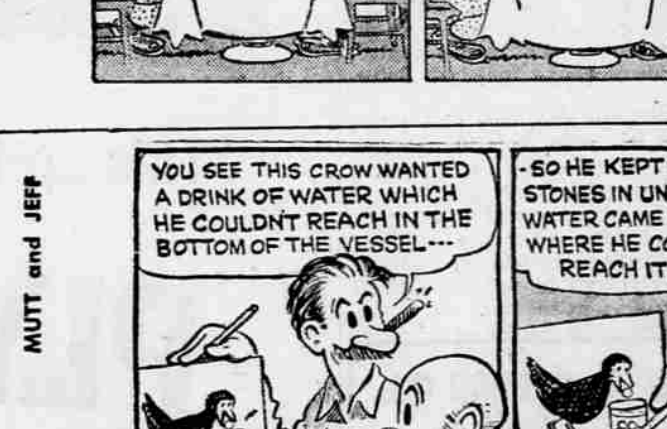
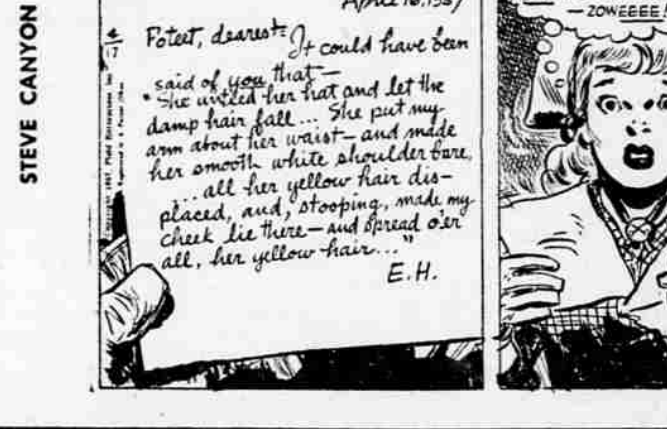
