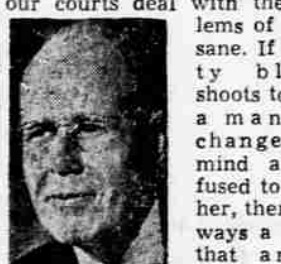
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The Medical Roundup

The Insane Man in Court

As I said recently, I often marvel at the curious ways in which our courts deal with the problems of the insane.

If a pretty blonde shoots to death a man who changed his mind and refused to marry her, there is always a chance that an "expert" will testify that when she pulled the trigger she did not know right from wrong and did not realize the consequences of her act. Under these circumstances, she can be judged temporarily insane, and then she can be put in a mental hospital until things blow over. But if a person who has always been so queer that his family, his friends and his townfolk have looked on him as crazy, commits a particularly atrocious and senseless murder, he is very likely to be hanged forthwith. The community will demand that he be "punished."

I remember an eccentric young man of low intelligence who married a sweet girl and took her out to his father's ranch for their honeymoon. A few days later he blew a big hole through her with a shotgun, and then went up the creek to catch some trout. When asked why he had done it, he said because the Voices had told him to.

The people in the community were so outraged at this "brutal and pointless" murder, and at the trial they were so angered because the lad showed not the slightest regret for what he had done, that he was quickly hanged. As I remember, the defense decided that with public sentiment so strong against him it was hardly worth while to present the facts that would have shown that he had never been quite sane.

I fear that in some courts today the best evidence as to a man's psychosis, such as would have to be given by relatives and friends, could be ruled out as not coming from qualified psychiatrists. I do know that a while ago, when it was essential to show that a testator was so blind he could hardly get around, his best friend, when on the stand, was not allowed to mention this. The opposing attorney's objection that these friends were not qualified eye-specialists was upheld! I did not question the judge's desire to be fair, but I was distressed to see that about all he was doing was to umpire the curious game that was being played by the two opposing attorneys. So far as I could see he made no effort to find out what the case was all about.

I was led to write this on reading about the man in New York who, for a long time was exploding bombs in public places. His reason for endangering the lives of hundreds of innocent people who were strangers to him was that when his lungs gave him trouble he was satisfied that the people for whom he had been working were in some way culpable.

His behavior was so typically that of a paranoiac that I doubt if one could find many psychiatrists who would feel the need even for interviewing him before declaring him insane.

But now I read that a judge says he must be tried. Why? According to the newspaper account, the court must go through that ancient game of seeming to determine whether, when the man was planting a bomb, (one particular bomb) he knew right from wrong, and realized the consequences of his act!

The fact is ignored that no one can ever determine such a thing definitely, and even if one could, there wouldn't be any sense in doing it. No psychiatrist, when judging of the sanity of a man in his office, worries about his knowledge of right and wrong. What the doctor wants to know is how the fellow has been behaving and thinking, and what reasons he gives for his peculiar behavior. In judging of a man's sanity, I always depend much on what a man's relatives think about him. Why? Because many a psychotic man can fool many people into accepting him as sane, but seldom can he fool his wife and his other close relatives.

Why cannot the judge just ask the eminent psychiatrists who have seen this bomb-exploder and who know about his behavior if he has been behaving in a way absolutely characteristic

of a certain type of insane man? If he has, why waste time trying him?

Hereditary Differences

We all know that certain men and women, from childhood, are very active and wide-awake. They are curious about most things; they want to explore any place into which they have been put; and some, because of their constant curiosity, eventually become able research workers. Other people from childhood on have very little interest in their surroundings; they don't care to explore much; they are not curious about anything, and hence they could never be of much use in a research laboratory.

Now, I read an article by William R. Thompson, in which he tells of the striking differences in the "exploratory activity" of a number of strains of mice bred in the laboratory. Some mice, when put into a new box, will immediately run all over the place and explore it thoroughly, while mice from another strain will just sit quietly. Since in such experiments the factor of environment is held constant, these differences in curiosity are evidently inherited and hereditary in nature.

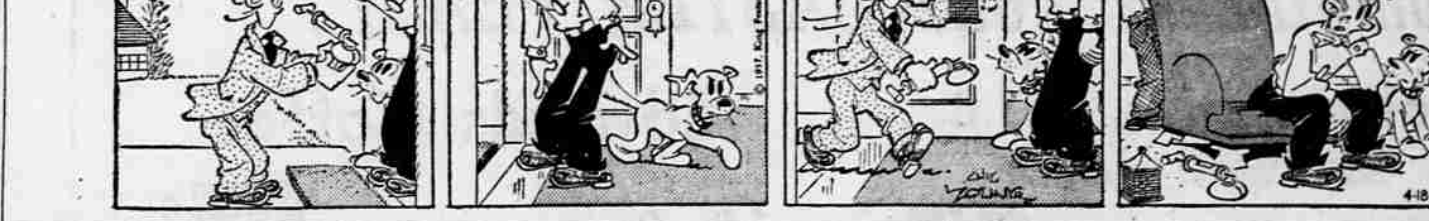
