Around Hollywood

Hollywood—(U.P.)—Tony Randall, a popular fixture on the "Mr. Peepers" television show for three years, has been "discovered" by the movies as a bright new comedy find, but this added fame he shrugs off.

"The fan reaction to my TV appearances was much bigger," he yawned. "But Hollywood has closed its eyes to TV. It's the enemy, I guess."

"The other day somebody wanted to know why movie theater audiences who see 'Oh Men, Oh Women' laugh when I come on before I say a word," Tony continued. "I told him that after all I'd appeared in more than 200 comedies on TV. He didn't understand."

Known in Dubuque

"Another fellow at the studio says now that I'm in the movies I'll be known in Dubuque. I refrained from asking him about the millions who saw the 200 TV shows I've done."

Being used to acclaim from his TV fans, Randall took it in stride when a producer-director Nunnally Johnson saw him in the play, "Inherit the Wind," and tapped him for the movie, "Oh Men, Oh Women."

Randall shared the film with such big Hollywood names as Franchot Tone and Ginger Rogers, but he wound up with the most back-patting from the critics. Twentieth Century-Fox promptly signed the pride of Tulsa, Okla., to a contract and plans to make him Fox's answer to Columbia's Jack Lemmon.

Reaction Disclosed

Randall's reaction to his new contract: "Well, people often tell me I look like Lemmon. Or Orson Bean. When Bean did 'Charley's Aunt' on TV I got more compliments for it."

To his smash "Oh Men, Oh Women" role: "It was one of the best parts ever written. Any actor who'd turn down that part is out of his head. Whoever played it would be successful. Nobody ever made a hit without a terrific role."

Randall currently is portraying the title role in "Will Success Spoil Rock Hunter?" in which he's Jayne Mansfield's "Lover Boy."

Students to Hear Air Force Officer

Ashland—Lt. Col. William B. Westfall of Ashland, has been invited to return to his hometown to address its high school student body on April 25.

This invitation is part of "Operation Hometown," an Air Force-wide community relations program. The overall objective in Operation Hometown is to assist educators in impressing upon high school students the extreme importance to their future and to the future of this country of remaining in school as long as possible and pursuing scientific and engineering courses to prepare and accept future jobs in these fields.

Colonel Westfall completed pilot training in 1942 and was sent to India, where he flew 110 flights over the "hump run" to China. From 1954 to 1956 he was stationed in Dohran, Saudi Arabia.

Returning to the United States in 1956, Colonel Westfall was assigned to Harlingen Air Force Base, Tex. He is presently assigned as Air Base group executive officer.

Colonel Westfall has been awarded the Distinguished Flying Cross with one Oak Leaf Cluster and the Air Medal.

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
