School District Boundaries Altered

School district boundary lines for two parcels of land were ordered changed Tuesday at a meeting of the Jackson county district boundary board.

A section of property between Springbrook rd., Crater Lake ave., Buckshot Hill rd., and Roberts rd., was changed from the Lone Pine school district to the Medford school district.

A section consisting of 6 1/2 acres, was ordered changed from the Medford district to the Lone Pine district. The land is between Roberts rd., Crater Lake highway, Whittle ave. and Crater Lake ave.

The land was transferred from the old Kenwood district to Medford in 1952. Purpose of the transfer at that time was to give Medford an additional school building site. It was later learned this site could not be used because it was in line with the Medford airport flight approach pattern. When the Kenwood district was dissolved last year, this portion would have gone to the Lone Pine district if it had not been part of Medford.

Too Many Hours For School Children

Harrisburg, Pa. —(U.P.)—The American elementary school child is putting in too many academic hours during a day, according to six foreign elementary school teachers who recently spent some time observing teaching methods and study programs in various Pennsylvania schools.

The visitors, representing Cambodia, Guatemala, Finland, Mexico, Egypt and Germany, said they thought the American public school system went far beyond the three R's in the elementary program and gave important emphasis to good citizenship.

The average American child was praised as "friendly, well-informed and very eager to learn." But the teachers said he should have more rest periods.

Divorcee Has Little Faith in Ball Hero

Chicago —(U.P.)—A young divorcee apparently has little faith in her husband's future as a baseball hero.

Mrs. Arleen Gatti, 20, of suburban Elmhurst, waived alimony from Albert Gatti, 23, when she obtained a divorce Monday on grounds of cruelty.

She said Gatti, a student and baseball star at Bradley University in Peoria, Ill., is interested in a baseball career. However, she said she had no interest in her former husband's potential baseball salary.

Her attorney, Joseph H. Becker, asked if she understood "that in waiving alimony you may be forfeiting a considerable amount as he may turn out to be another Babe Ruth or Joe DiMaggio?"

"I understand," she replied, and dismissed the subject.

She accepted only support payments of \$15 a week for her daughter, Marie, 8 months, in the proceedings before Superior Court Judge Harry Hershenson.

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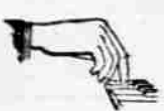
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
