Sample Shipment of Hardwood Sent to SF

A sample shipment of black oak logs is being sent to a prominent furniture manufacturing firm in San Francisco by the Swede Basin Lumber company, as a tentative move toward establishment of a hard wood mill in southern Oregon.

At a recent meeting of Illinois Valley hardwood enthusiasts, donations of oak logs were asked for the shipment, which is being made on a non-profit basis. Both green and dry lumber is wanted the drying to be done at the Sunny Valley hardwood kiln.

The San Francisco firm has shown an interest in hardwood grown in this area, and has asked for a sample lot.

Activities Listed for UO Athletes

Eugene — (U.P.) — Coach Bill Bowerman said today that Jim Bailey would run the mile for the first time this season against Idaho Saturday. Bailey astounded the track world last year by running the mile in under four minutes and defeating fellow countryman John Landy.

University Of Oregon Eugene — Coach Bill Bowerman's powerful track and field team, fresh from resounding victory over Washington, will be heavily favored Saturday to continue its long Northern division dual meet winning streak at the expense of the Idaho Vandals.

In other action this week end, Oregon's golfers try for the Northern California intercollegiate tournament championship at Santa Cruz, the Duck tennis team goes outside the conference to play Portland and Seattle here Friday and Saturday, and the Duckling baseball team meets Medford high Friday and the Oregon State Rooks Saturday at Howe Field.

All of the events here are a part of the Duck Preview week-end, an annual event for the high school seniors of the state. Coach Len Casanova's football squad is also planning a lengthy scrimmage Saturday as the climax to the first week of the spring practice.

Track Shifts Eyed

Coach Bowerman is expected to make several shifts in his personnel, with the key move sending Steve Anderson, the brilliant sophomore, into the high hurdle race for the first time this spring. Anderson, who ran 9.5 last week in the 100 and placed in the broad jump and javelin, will not run the sprints against the Vandals. Another possible shift will send Jim Grele, the undefeated sophomore miler, into the 880-yard run and put Jim Bailey in the mile for the first time this season.

Bailey started his work late this spring and this is the first time Bowerman has indicated he thought the sub-four minute runner was ready for the mile. The final decision on this move will be made Thursday or Friday. If Bailey runs the mile, he will face the division's top miler this spring, Ray Hatton, and the Vandals ace is also expected to give Mark Robbins, the fine Oregon rookie, a stiff test in the two mile race.

Coach Sid Milligan has a five man team led by Bob Prall and Capt. Chuck Huggins in the golf tournament. The other Webfoots include Barry Ott, Don Bick and sophomore Duane Ankanberg. The play opens with team competition on Thursday and moves into individual competition Friday and Saturday.

Russell Jones Named Polk Award Winner

New York — (U.P.) — United Press Correspondent Russell Jones was named today to receive the George Polk Memorial Award of the Overseas Press club for the "best reporting requiring exceptional courage and enterprise abroad."

Jones covered the revolution in Hungary from its beginning and was the only American correspondent to remain in Budapest for the month during which the Russians moved in and put down the revolt.

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
