# Nellie Fox Key Contributor In Fast Start of White Sox

Casey Stengel says Al Lopez is "too good a manager to keep finishing second all the time," and judging from their jackrabbit getaway, the Chicago White Sox are bent on proving Ole Case a phooft.

Off to his best start in his last five years as a manager, Lopez has the White Sox in first place with five victories in six games. "I said I felt we could win this year before the season began and it still goes," the White Sox declared following Thursday's 9-4 victory over the Detroit Tigers.

Leading the way for the White Sox at the moment is little Nellie Fox, with his customary wad of chewing tobacco and a fancy .423 batting average. Fox was a key contributor in Thursday's triumph over the Tigers with a pair of doubles and a single. Southpaw Jack Harshman was credited with his second victory although ancient Dixie Howell took over for him in the seventh. Steve Gromek was the loser.

The Indians, who started poorly this year, defeated the Athletics 5-3, even though they were held to six hits. They broke a 1-1 tie in the seventh with a three-run rally that was highlighted by Vic Wertz's two-run double off loser Wally Burnette. Early Wynn was the winner but he gave way to Ray Narleski after yielding a two-run homer to Gus Zernial in the eighth.

Ted Williams continued his hot hitting for the Red Sox with a double and two singles in a 12-7 decision over the Senators. Williams' three hits boosted his average to .455, best in the American league. George Susce Jr., yielded three hits over the last 5 2/3 innings to

gain the victory after relieving starter Willard Nixon. Clint Courtney hit a two-run homer off Nixon in the fourth. The Yankees and Orioles were not scheduled. Cincinnati, which opened the campaign with four straight defeats, won its fourth in a row by beating Chicago, 6-3.

Lawrence Goes Distance  
Brooks Lawrence, a 19-game winner last year, gave up nine hits but became the first Cincinnati pitcher to go the distance this year.

The Redlegs made only six hits but capitalized on four Cub errors, two of them by shortstop Ernie Banks. Errors by Banks and second baseman Casey Wise gave the Redlegs their first run in the opening inning and they added three more in the second off rookie Dick Drott with the help of a single by George Crowe and doubles by Ed Bailey and Don Hoak.

The only other National league game scheduled was the one between the Giants and Dodgers but it was postponed because of rain.

Oakland, Calif.—(U.P.)—Kaiser Aluminum and Chemical Corporation reports net earnings for the first three months of the year were below those of the first quarter of 1956, although net sales rose.

The company reported net earnings of \$8,267,000, equal to 51 cents a common share. Earnings for the quarter a year ago were \$11,243,000, equal to 74 cents a share.

Net sales for the quarter were \$97,527,000 compared to \$87,393,000 for the first three months of 1956.
