

Shantz Loses in Start as Yank; Bevos Lose 6th Straight Game

Score Fans Ten In Indian Win

It was a great day for pitchers in the American league Saturday as Herb Score of the Cleveland Indians, Mike Fournieles of the Baltimore Orioles and Tom Brewer of the Boston Red Sox turned in impressive performances in leading their teams to victory.

Score allowed only three hits and struck out 10 men, including seven in the first three innings, in hurling the Indians to a 2-1 triumph over the Detroit Tigers.

Cleveland collected only seven hits off the combined slants of Paul Foytack and Steve Gromek. The Indians picked up their decisive run in the eighth inning on singles by Al Smith and Vic Wertz and an error by Detroit right fielder Al Kaline.

Brewer scattered five hits in pitching the Red Sox to a 2-1 victory over the Yankees but needed relief help from Ike Delock in the ninth inning. Delock entered the game with two on and one out. He struck out Pinch Hitter Elston Howard and retired Hank Bauer on a fly to left field.

The Red Sox scored their winning run in the third on a walk, a single by Billy Klaus, another pass and Dick Gernert's force out. Bobby Shantz, making his first official start for the Yankees, gave up eight hits.

Hank Sauer hit two more home runs and Ossie Virgil contributed another in pacing the New York Giants to a 10-2 victory over the Philadelphia Phillies. Ruben Gomez allowed eight hits in picking up his third victory, while the Giants pounded Robin Roberts and three other Phil pitchers for 13 sacrifices.

Don Newcombe, chased in his first two starts, finally garnered his first victory of the season as the Brooklyn Dodgers turned back the Pittsburgh Pirates, 6-2. Newcombe scattered nine hits and added two singles in the Dodgers' 14-hit attack on five Pittsburgh hurlers.

The Cardinals-Cubs game at Chicago was postponed because of rain and wet grounds.

In night games, Chicago was at Kansas City in the American league and Milwaukee visited Cincinnati in the National league.

Occidental Man Sets Vault Record
Stanford, Calif.—(U.P.)—Bob Gutowski, slender chemistry student from Occidental college, smashed the 15-year-old world record in the pole vault Saturday with a graceful leap of 15 feet, 8-1/4 inches on his first try.

The blond athlete set the standard after taking second place in the broad jump of a dual meet with Stanford. He said afterwards that he felt "a bit tired" as the pole vault started.

Gutowski bettered the mark 15 feet 7-3/4 inches which the great Cornelius Warmerdam set at Modesto, Calif., in May, 1942. However, Warmerdam still holds an indoor record of 15 feet, 8-1/2 inches set in Chicago in 1943.

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Hollies Get Lopsided 10-2 Victory

paw Don Kildoo hurled an impressive four-hitter Saturday to give the Hollywood Stars their fourth straight triumph over the slumping Portland Beavers by a lopsided score of 10-2.

Kildoo, in his first mound start for the Stars, had a shutout going until the ninth frame with only two singles against him. But it was spoiled by Beaver outfielder Frank Ernaga who connected for his first homer of the year with teammate Jack Littrell aboard. The loser was Johnny Briggs (0-1), the first of four Beaver tossers.

The victory gave Hollywood a 4-0 lead in the series and was Portland's sixth loss in a row. The Stars collected 12 hits.

San Francisco—(U.P.)—The San Francisco Seals clouted eight hits good for seven runs in the seventh inning Saturday to beat Vancouver 8-1 and drop the Mounties out of a first place tie in the Pacific Coast league.

Spike Briggs Forced Out Of Tiger Job
Detroit—(U.P.)—The Briggs name, a part of Detroit Tiger baseball for nearly four decades was removed from the Tiger scene Friday when Walter O. (Spike) Briggs Jr., resigned as executive vice president, general manager and director.

Only the stadium retains the designation of "Briggs".

"And I wonder how long it'll be before they shange that," Briggs said.

Briggs was embittered over his forced resignation which was brought on by published reports of his differences with the Tigers' owners.

Harvey R. Hansen, Detroit lumberman and president of the team, and John E. Fetzer, chairman of the board, met with Briggs Friday after all three had denied Thursday Briggs' blast that the owners were trying to run the team "like a factory."

Spike was named president when his Father Walter O. Briggs, died five years ago. He wanted to hold onto the club but in order to settle the estate the team was ordered sold. He tried to buy it himself and failed.
