Plumber Burns to Death in Portland

Portland (U.P.) — Alvin E. Cozine, a 25-year-old Portland plumber, burned to death early Saturday and his two children were injured in a fire which badly damaged their home.

Police credited the quick action of Special Patrolman George Sisson for saving the children. Sisson was cruising in the area when he smelled smoke which he traced to the Cozine home. He pounded on the door but got no response.

He called firemen who broke in and rescued the children, Cheryl Ann, 5 months, and Deborah, 2 1/2 years. They were taken to Emanuel hospital. Officers said they had overcome by smoke.

Firemen found Cozine's body in the kitchen where he had collapsed in an apparent attempt to fight his way out of the house.

Mrs. Cozine had left to take a baby sitter home and she didn't return until the children were being put in an ambulance.
