The Medical Roundup

The Solving of a Problem

In Scope Weekly, for Jan. 16, I found a fascinating article describing how the officials of the Jewish Hospital, of Brooklyn—a large hospital which is located in a turbulent slum area—solved the problems that faced them due to much vandalism and hooliganism on the part of the youngsters in the neighborhood.

In spite of the fact that the hospital had 14 watchmen constantly trying to protect the property, the place was plagued by a never-ending series of episodes in which windows were broken, damage was done to the parking cars of the visiting physicians, and youngsters ran screaming through the corridors.

When the police felt that they could not cope with the situation, the hospital officials solved the problem quickly and simply by organizing a neighborhood boys' club. They delighted the boys by supplying them with sports' equipment; giving them coaching in sports, and organizing ball games and picnics. They had a big contest for leaders of the club, and 20 of the toughest and roughest of the boys were elected directors. The hospital supplied the club members with a T-shirt with the hospital name and emblem printed on it. A popular service given to the club members is supplied by a veterinary physician to whom the boys' sick pets may be brought for free treatment. Every so often now the boys are taken through the hospital so that they can know about the different divisions; they know the problems the hospital faces, and now they have taken over the responsibility for guarding the place. They enjoy going into the pediatric ward to visit with the children who are sick and paralyzed with polio.

I can remember so well that, when I was a teen-age boy, what I wanted above all things was a club-house with a gymnasium where someone could teach me and my pals boxing and wrestling, and coach us in handball and basketball. Such a club could have been a rallying-point for all the boys in the neighborhood.

Sixty Seven Years of Practice

I recently read about an old friend, Dr. Andy Hall, of Mt. Vernon, Ill., who has been practicing now for 67 years. He is 92, and a few weeks ago, when I sat at dinner with him, he looked

ed like a man of 50. He was wide-awake, keen, strong, and full of fun. He is a good public speaker. When people ask him why he is so strong and well at 92 he says that he used good judgment in selecting his parents. In this he agrees with Dr. Raymond Pearl, of Johns Hopkins University—the world's great expert on longevity—who always said that the surest way to live long was to pick four grandparents and two parents whose ages at death would add up to at least 500 years. Like most other human faculties, old age is inherited.

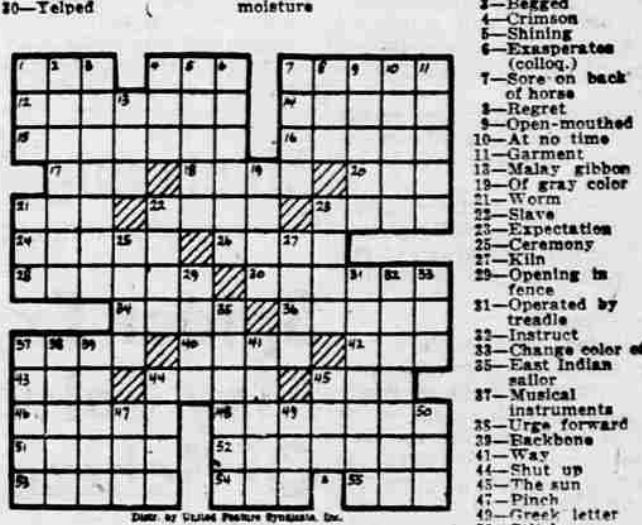

Mercury To Pass Between Earth, Sun

San Francisco — (U.P.) — The planet Mercury will pass between the Earth and the sun Sunday, but don't look at it through a telescope.

Astronomers at Morrison planetarium said the event, known as the transit of Mercury, will take place between 4:07 p.m. and 6:19 p.m. (PST).

The passage can be seen only by using a telescope. However, astronomers warned against looking at the sun through a telescope or binoculars. Instant and permanent blindness may be the result.

Instead, they said to turn the telescope toward the sun and then hold a piece of white paper about 12 inches behind the eyepiece. The eyepiece will project an enlarged image of the sun on the paper and Mercury will be seen as a little black dot.

Radio Operator Exams Scheduled at OTI

Federal Communications commission radio operator examinations will be held at Oregon Technical Institute, Klamath Falls, Saturday, May 25, according to J. H. Hallock, engineer in charge, Portland, OTI is about three miles northeast of Klamath Falls.

Radioteletype classes will be held at 8:30 a.m., radiotelephone at 9 a.m., amateur code at 11 a.m. and amateur written at 1 p.m. The examination will consist of code and written tests.

Pencils, pens, ink and rulers are to be furnished by applicants and those taking code tests must provide telephone receivers with standard plugs, Hallock said.
