Medford high in its finest baseball games of the season bounced the Klamath Falls Pelicans 12 to 2 and 5 to 2 at Klamath Saturday.

The 12 to 2 tussle counted in the Southern Oregon conference, giving Medford a 2-3 standing and tying the Tornado with the Pel for third spot in the chase.

Batting by Dennis King and Bob Pond and eight-hit throwing by Dick McLaughlin paced the Tornado crew in the opener. Ernie Tyler tossed a three-hitter for Medford in the shortened game and Larry Perkins, McLaughlin and King were the big men at bat.

Pond hit four for four, one a double, in the starter and King three for five including a homer. Perkins socked two for five and Gordon Owsley two for four.

McLaughlin issued one base on balls and fanned four batsmen.

Medford got four runs in the sixth inning on a walk to Owsley, singles by Pond and Perkins and King's homer.

Three runs in the first inning made the difference in the last game. They came on a base on balls, two stolen bases, a wild pitch, singles by Perkins and Ron Peery and a double by King. Tyler walked one man and whiffed seven in the game. McLaughlin hit two for two and Perkins two for three.

The Red Raiders of the Rogue romped over the Portlanders 9 to 4 and 11 to 4 Saturday after a 5 to 0 triumph on Friday.

In the first game yesterday the PSC nine got all its runs in the opening inning on triples by Connie Kilmer and Rich McElwain, singles by Bob Biglow and Bob Jorgenson and a walk. SOC caught up by the end of the third inning and tucked the win away with five runs in the sixth stanza. Leroy King, Dick Nix, Willie Jones and Jim McAbee singled and Ned Landers doubled in the frame.

King hit three for four and Ned Landers, Ron Owings, Nix and Jones two for four for SOC and McElwain two for three for PSC. In fashioning a seven-hitter Ned Landers whiffed seven batters and walked two. Jerry Aman of the Vikes struck out two and walked one.
