Survey Shows Soviet Women Do Heavy Construction Work

Moscow—U.P.—Russia's women, famed for their hefty build and ability to do hard work, appear to have over-fulfilled their goal in the struggle for equality of the sexes.

The latest Soviet survey shows that women hold 30 per cent of the arduous building and road construction jobs.

At least 45 per cent of Soviet industrial "manpower" is made up of women.

Soviet females hold 49 per cent of the jobs in government and administration, 70 per cent in the teaching profession, and 76 per cent in the medical profession.

While figures are not available for Soviet agriculture, it is quite certain that women are the backbone of collective and state farms.

War Impetus

All of these percentages skyrocketed during World War II when Soviet women took over the work at home for their fighting men.

The men returned from the

war to find that not only had their womenfolk managed to keep the near-sinking ship afloat—they had in many cases become expert professional workers.

Although Soviet women are indisputably proud of their advances in the workaday world, they never intended these advances to be made at the cost of chivalry and respect due their fair sex.

One sturdy young Russian girl explained:

"During the Bolshevik revolution, my mother, who was dainty, graceful and lady-like, tried her best to look and act like a man. She would not allow anyone to carry her across a mud puddle, help her into her coat, or open the door for her."

"Now, 30 years later, she insists that I be a model of etiquette and bourgeois gentility. Isn't it strange how women will change their minds?"
