Bogota Students Ask Support in General Strike

Bogota — (U.P.) — Students angered by the death of a teenager in week end rioting here called on the Colombian people today to support a 24-hour "general strike" against President Gustavo Rojas Pinilla.

Twelve opposition newspapers in various cities responded to the call by announcing that they will suspend publication indefinitely. Two of them shut down Sunday, saying that emergency regulations made it impossible for them to publish.

Sixteen-year-old Ernesto Apario, who died of a throat wound Sunday night, was the first fatality of the noisy but usually non-violent anti-government demonstrations that flared up here last week.

'Routine Exercise'
He is believed to have been injured by the firing pin of a tear gas bomb when police gassed the congregation of the Porciuncula church, whose priest was preaching an anti-government sermon.

The army took over the city Saturday night, ostensibly as part of a "routine military exercise."

The disorders in Colombia were touched off by Rojas' aspiration for a second term.

The president, a lieutenant general seized power from Laureano Gomez in a military coup d'etat in June, 1953. A little more than a year later, he was "elected" president by a constitutional convention.

Wenatchee Hit By Flash Flood

Wenatchee, Wash. — (U.P.) — A flash flood hit Wenatchee Sunday night with water reaching two feet deep in downtown streets before it receded.

The storm and flash flood rolled out of Number Two canyon at 6 p.m. and not until nearly four hours later did the water subside.

Mud and debris piled up on lawns of more than 200 homes and the basements of many downtown business houses were flooded.

The flash flood forced the evacuation of a number of homes and cut off electric power in most of the city for several hours. Virtually all telephones were out of action for a time.

At one point in east Wenatchee the flood gouged out a gully 10 feet wide.

\$64,000 Challenge Contestants Flunk

New York — (U.P.) — All four contestants on the CBS-TV "\$64,000 Challenge" quiz flunked out Sunday night but managed to haul away \$24,000 among them. Metropolitan opera baritone Robert Merrill and shoemaker Michael Della Rocca, Baldwin, N.Y., failed on the \$32,000 question in the "opera" category.

On the \$8,000 Shakespeare question, policeman Redmond O'Hanlon, New York, and Chester Alan Arthur, a San Francisco news vendor, were unable to give the right answer.

Merrill and Della Rocca split \$16,000 they had won previously and O'Hanlon and Arthur shared \$8,000. Arthur is a grandson of the 21st president of the United States.
