

Soviet To Be Asked For Explanation

Moscow — (U.P.) — American Charge D'Affaires John Guthrie said he would ask the Soviet Foreign Ministry today for an explanation of its order expelling U.S. Embassy Secretary Martin Bower Jr.

The Foreign Ministry charged Bower with "conduct unbecoming a diplomat" in a note declaring him persona non grata Tuesday but gave no reason for its charge.

Bower, a native of Holyoke, Mass., is the fifth American diplomat expelled from Russia this year. He has served in Moscow three years and recently was promoted to second secretary after serving as attaché in charge of administration.

Naval Commander Sinks on TV Quiz

New York — (U.P.) — Navy Cmdr. Edward Peary Stafford set sail for \$96,000 on the "\$64,000 Question" television quiz Tuesday night and sank.

Although he missed the \$96,000 question, Stafford was able to salvage \$64,000 of the prize money he had won in previous appearances on the program.

London Gets Warning Of Polio Epidemic

London — (U.P.) — A warning of a possible polio epidemic was issued by the Health Ministry today.

Figures for the first four months of this year were higher than in the epidemic year of 1950 when 7,760 cases were reported. The ministry is distributing a circular to local authorities on how polio outbreaks should be handled.

German Church To Refuse Communists

Berlin — (U.P.) — Bishop Otto Dibelius, titular head of the German Evangelical church, told Germans Tuesday the church will refuse to confirm youths who take part in atheist Communist youth consecration ceremonies.

The evangelical bishop of Berlin and the Soviet zone province of Brandenburg read his statement in East Berlin's Marienkirche in the heart of Berlin's Soviet sector.

He said youths are free to decide between Christian confirmation and the Communist rites but the church will not confirm anyone who goes through the Red youth ceremony.

Dibelius also reported the church is short of pastors in the Soviet zone because the Communists will not permit clergymen to move from West Germany to East Germany.
