

Low Echo Reunion Announced; Season's Registration Opens

A reunion of all former campers and prospective campers of Low Echo, the established camp of Rogue Valley Girl Scout council, will be held at Hawthorne park south of the Girl Scout office, Saturday, May 11, from 12:30 to 3:00 p.m. Each girl is asked to take her own sack lunch; the beverage will be served by the camp committee.

The junior camp committee and Senior Scouts in the area are planning an afternoon of games, contests and camp songs. This will be a time to meet former camp and cabin mates as well as to meet the new campers, it is pointed out.

Camp Low Echo is located approximately 50 miles from Medford near the resort community, Lake of the Woods. The 80 acres comprising the site has a fine waterfront and is surrounded by an evergreen forest. The camp has been developed the last 11 years to be one of the most outstanding in the Pacific Northwest, Girl Scout officials say.

The camp is designed to accommodate about 150 girls plus staff each session. There are five units for girls of the Intermediate Scout age level with each unit housing 24 girls of the same age. There is a sixth unit of 15 girls who are program aides and counselors in training. A seventh unit, to be known as the "pioneer unit" will be initiated for the first time this year for girls 14 and 15 years of age or who have completed their curved bar unit, or who are going into the ninth grade of school.

This Girl Scout camp is a member of the American Camping association, meaning that the camp meets or exceeds minimum standards of this association and is entitled to all rights and privileges using information regarding camping. Low Echo was evaluated by three members of the American Camping association last year and received a superior rating.

Registration Open
Registration for camp is now open. All campers are urged to register as soon as possible while there is a choice of sessions to attend. There will be one 7-day session, July 7 to 14 inclusive; then three 10-day sessions which are July 15 to July 25; July 26 to August 5 and August 6 to August 16. Registrations must be paid at the Scout office or mailed to the office, 500 East Main street, Medford. At the time of registration, health form cards are given or mailed to the campers if they do not come to register in person. This health card must be filled out ten days prior to going to camp and returned to the Scout office 6 days before going to camp. The balance of the camp fee must also be paid 6 days before going to camp. No fees or health cards can be accepted at camp. This is all taken care of and paid to Rogue Valley Girl Scout Council, Inc.

All campers are to leave from and return to the Greyhound bus garage located at Fourth and Apple streets, Medford. This bus service was inaugurated last year and was found to be tremendously successful. Campers are allowed to bring one suitcase and a bedroll.

Miss Irene Knox of College Park, Md., is returning this year as director for her third consecutive year. Many of last year's staff members are returning also.

In addition to the camp director, there will be a unit leader and three assistant counselors for each unit of 24 girls. There are many different counselors hired to do specialized jobs such as registered nurse, dietitian, business manager, cooks, handy man, waterfront director and her assistants for swimming, boating and canoeing. There is also a handicraft director, a hiking counselor and a nature study counselor.

"All of these work together towards a common goal to help the girls have a fine educational and healthful experience in the out-of-doors," Scout officials state.

The Girl Scout organization is sponsored by the United Medford Crusade, Ashland and Talent Youth Fund drive, the Josephine County United Fund, and fund drives in the West Siskiyou district. The camping program is intended to be self supporting but non-profit. The fees the campers pay are for the supplies and operation of the camp.
