Gettogether club will hold a card party in the Moose hall, Wednesday, May 15, at 1 p.m. The public is invited to attend.

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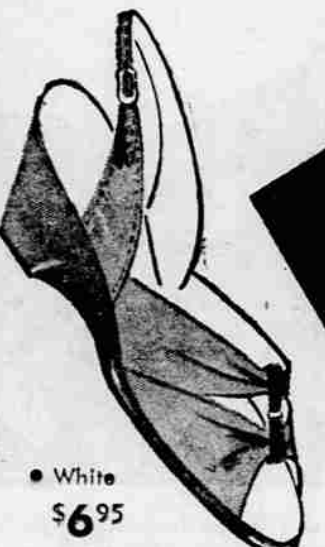
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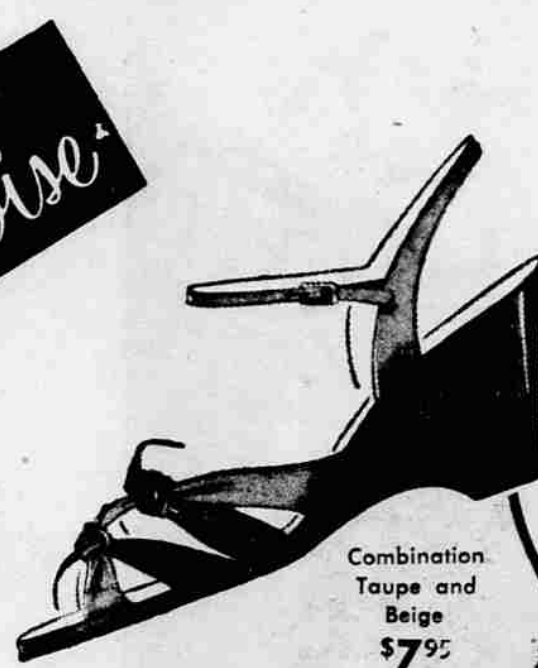
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
