Mrs. Clarence Jordan, Mrs. Lee Willets and Mrs. Minnie Bryant are in charge of the supper Friday.

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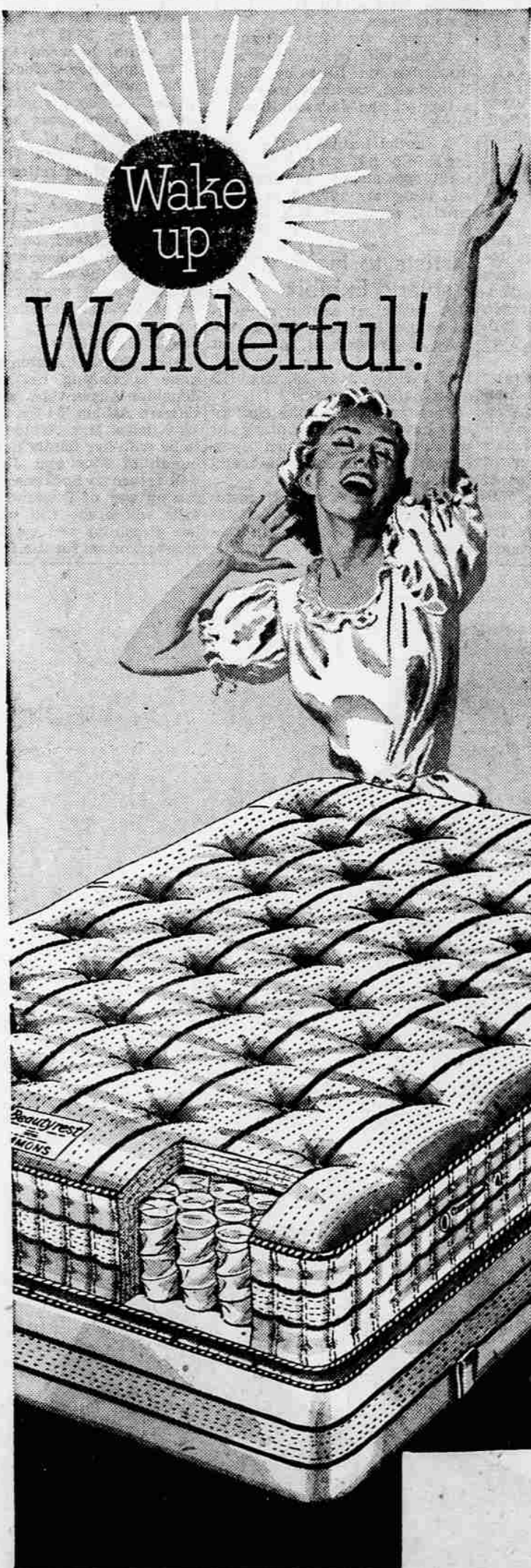
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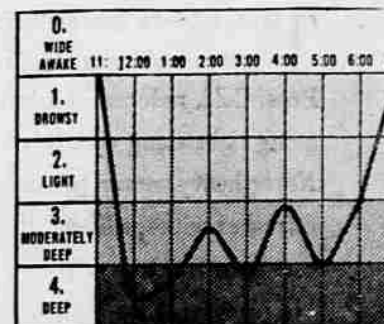
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
