

# Johnson's Great Relief Job Places Braves On Top Alone

Ernie Johnson replaced Bob Buhl as Brooklyn's Public Enemy No. 1 today on the strength of a second straight brilliant relief job that enabled the Milwaukee Braves to take sole occupancy of first place in the National League.

A 32-year-old native of Brattleboro, Vt., Johnson shut out the Dodgers for 2 1/3 innings Tuesday night to preserve the Braves' 3-2 victory and extend his string of scoreless innings against Brooklyn to 8 1/3. Johnson blanked the Dodgers with one hit for six innings on May 5 when he picked up his only victory of the current season.

## Phil Beat Redlegs

The triumph over the Dodgers boosted the Braves into undisputed possession of the league lead when the Philadelphia Phillies ended the Cincinnati Red-

legs' 12-game winning streak, 10-8, on Ed Bouchee's ninth-inning homer.

Ruben Gomez won his fifth game as the New York Giants whipped the St. Louis Cardinals, 5-3, and the Pittsburgh Pirates beat the Chicago Cubs, 8-6, in the other N.L. games. Duke Maas also scored his fifth victory when he pitched the Detroit Tigers to a 2-0 win over the Boston Red Sox in the only American league game. Kansas City at New York, Chicago at

Washington and Cleveland at Baltimore were rained out.

## Nats, Chisox Might Make Big Trade

Reports of an impending deal between the Chicago White Sox and the Washington Senators cropped up today as other major league clubs sought to beat the midnight deadline on the 25-player limit.

The Washington Post and Times Herald said the White Sox were seeking outfielder Roy Sievers and infielder Pete Runnels of the Senator's in exchange for outfielders Larry Doby and Jim Rivera and pitcher Bill Fischer.

The deal was proposed by Chuck Comiskey, president of the White Sox, the paper said, adding that Chicago Manager Al Lopez definitely was interested in acquiring Sievers and Runnels.

## No Names Mentioned

Lopez told the United Press, "We have been talking with the Nats since spring training to see if we can work out a deal that will improve both clubs." But he said he never mentioned any names because "it's not nice to mention names to other clubs."

The White Sox, meanwhile got down to the 25-player limit by optioning pitcher Jim McDonald to Indianapolis of the American association and handing outfielder Bob Kennedy his outright release.

The New York Giants acquired veteran pitcher Sandy Consuegra from the Baltimore Orioles for an estimated \$15,000 Tuesday night. To make room for the 36-year-old right hander, the Giants are expected to drop either southpaw pitcher Pete Burnside or infielder Foster Castleman.

## Cards Sell Rookie

The St. Louis Cardinals reduced their roster to 26 players by selling rookie southpaw Robert G. Smith to the Pittsburgh Pirates. The Pirates, in turn, optioned outfielder John Powers to Columbus of the International league.

The Senators and the Cleveland Indians must drop three players before tonight's deadline, while the Milwaukee Braves must slice two men. In addition to the Giants and the Cardinals, the Cincinnati Redlegs, the Brooklyn Dodgers, the New York Yankees and the Boston Red Sox each were one player over the limit.

## Fine Levied On Umpire Returned

San Francisco — Pacific Coast league President Leslie O'Connor announced Tuesday that Umpire John Nenezich has been fined \$100 for filing an erroneous report on the ousting of a PCL manager from a game.

O'Connor said Nenezich reported that he ejected manager Clay Bryant of Los Angeles from a game at Sacramento on April 23 for "abusive, insulting and very objectionable remarks."

But he said the umpire admitted later that he had not heard Bryant make the remarks and did not know that Bryant made them, but "merely surmized."

O'Connor levied the fine against Bryant, but ordered it returned when it was revealed at a hearing that the remarks were made by an unnamed player on the bench.

In other actions O'Connor ruled that all PCL players must wear protective helmets when batting, and empowered umpires to remove from a game any pitcher who deliberately throws a "bean ball" or attempts to "dust off" a batter.

## Wild Pitches Mar No-Hitter

Albany — Albany high school pitcher Duan Spilde had a no-hit, no-run game going against Sweet Home Tuesday night with two men out and two strikes on the next batter in the bottom of the seventh, the final inning.

One man was on base. Then Spilde threw three straight wild pitches. The runner moved around to score.

The next pitch was a strike. Albany won 4-1 and Spilde at least still had a no-hitter.

## Joe Giambra Scores TKO Over Vejar

Oakland, Calif. — "Sure, we'd like to fight Kid Gavilan next. Joey probably would take him out after seven rounds, but the first would make money around here."

Thus did Mike Scanlan, Joey Giambra's profit-minded manager, scan the field for his handsome middleweight contender who stopped Chico Vejar, Stamford, Conn., in seven rounds Tuesday night.

"Joey's ready for a title bout—he's right at his peak, but nobody knows what'll happen until after the Robinson-Basilio fight," Scanlan said.

## Plenty Busy

Giambra, sixth-ranked among the middleweight contenders, was kept plenty busy Tuesday night. Vejar always carried the fight to his taller opponent and constantly scored with lefts to the face but paid the price by getting rocked with lightning one-two counters to his battered features.

There were no knockdowns although Vejar slipped to the canvas late in the third round after Giambra landed a left hook.

Giambra, who weighed 160 to Vejar's 158½, brought things to an end in the seventh round when he drove Vejar into the ropes with a stiff right to the head then battered Chico at will.

Referee Frankie Carter wedged himself between the fighters and halted the bout as Vejar's left eye began dripping blood from one of Giambra's blows. The time was 39 seconds.

## Score Continues Good Progress

Cleveland, Ohio — The Cleveland Indians' injured southpaw ace Herb Score continued "slow, steady progress in the right direction," his doctors reported today, but said they have not been able to completely examine his injured right eye.

Dr. Charles I. Thomas, the eye specialist who has treated the young hurler since he was struck down by a line drive May 7, hoped to complete his diagnosis, "before the week is out."

"There was some change today, but not too much. He is progressing well and we should get the answers to most of our questions soon," the doctors reported.

Dr. Thomas said hemorrhage residue continues to delay the most important tests of the center eye.

## Bobby Boyd, Vaughn Mix

Chicago — Middleweight Bobby Boyd, trying to fight back into title contention, meets a major stumbling block in Willie Vaughn tonight in a 10-round battle before the television cameras.

Vaughn was ranked only 10th among the 160-pounders by the National Boxing association, and he has an overall record of 32 wins, 13 losses and four draws, compared to Boyd's 42 victories and only seven defeats.

But Vaughn's most important fight was a "no contest" with Joey Giardello.

## Jaw Broken

Boyd boasted a nine-fight winning streak and was one of the top three ranked middleweights until last Sept. 28 when he met Giardello. The Philadelphia pugilist pummeled him mercilessly and finally won by a knockout in the fifth round, breaking Boyd's jaw with the finishing punch.

While Boyd was out of the picture, Vaughn, a California state champion, took on Giardello at Kansas City March 27, and with crowding style, gave Giardello a rough evening. Two of the officials gave him the decision, but because the referee marked his car with an incorrect scoring system, the bout was scored no contest.

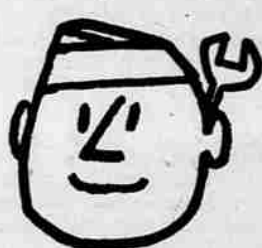
## Welter Champ Spars at Spokane

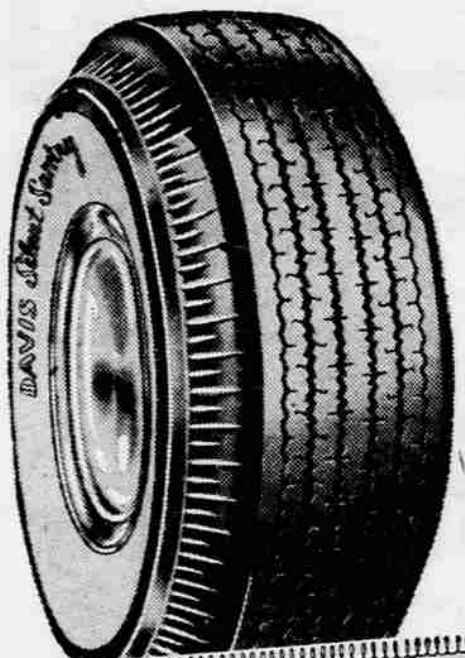
