Pulp-Paper Union To Vote on New Pact

Portland — Labor and management representatives from 45 Pacific coast pulp and paper mills Wednesday reached a tentative agreement on a new contract.

The new contract, which offers a 3 1/2 per cent general wage increase averaging 9 1/2 cents an hour, is being submitted to a referendum vote of the union membership.

The agreement was made by the United Papermakers and Paperworkers and the International Brotherhood of Pulp, Sulphite and Paper Mill workers with the Pacific Coast association of Pulp and Paper manufacturers.

The increases, if approved, would give 19,429 hourly paid workers in Washington, Oregon and California a total pay boost of \$3,859,000 a year. Individual hikes would give men a base rate of \$2.01 and for women \$1.70. Journeymen mechanics would get \$2.72 1/2 an hour.

Lumber Employees To Continue Talks

Portland — Federal mediators said today another meeting probably would be scheduled soon between lumber employees and officials representing some 35,000 members of the International Woodworkers of America.

Talks on a new contract failed to produce agreement Wednesday.

Woodworkers have a two-year contract running to next April with a provision for a wage reopening this year. Employers have said lumber market conditions are not strong enough for wage hikes.

Savings Bond Sales Show Decline in Area

Sales of U. S. savings bonds in Jackson county totaled \$55,960 during April, less than the total for April, 1956.

Sales during April, 1956, totaled \$116,358. Sales through April 30, 1957, totaled \$343,757 compared to \$458,207 for the same period in 1956.

Total sales for the state last month was \$2,762,063 compared to \$3,244,899 for April, 1956. The state's total of sales through April 30, 1957, was \$12,900,519 compared to \$15,861,280 for the same period in 1956.
