

Oregon State Boasts Sports in Quantity

Corvallis — Medford was favored to retain its Class A-1 championship as nearly 400 athletes gathered here today for opening of the annual Oregon State High School track and field meet.

In the Class A-2 division, the field was wide open. Last year's champ, Redmond, has moved into the A-1 division. Class B schools will hold a state meet of their own at Springfield Saturday.

Oregon State College, Corvallis — Those who enjoy their sports entertainment in large quantities could get it on visiting Corvallis and the Oregon State college campus this week end.

Here's what was in store: 1. State high school Class A-1 and A-2 track and field championships, with perennial-champion Medford again in the driver's seat and some 380 entries

primed for action. Preliminaries were slated today with finals Saturday at Bell field.

2. State high school tennis tournament on the OSC courts, with 125 top prep netters entered —headed by defending singles titlists Harry Doyle, Grant of Portland, and Patti Miller, Washington of Portland. Matches began this morning, with champions to be crowned on Saturday afternoon.

3. Final spring football game scrimmage for the Oregon State Beavers, defending Pacific Coast conference champions, at Parker stadium immediately following the track meet. Coach Tommy Prothro's single-wing varsity goes against T-formation opponents, with All-America tailback candidate Joe Francis in the driver's seat.

4. Northern division dual tennis, sending Washington's defending champions against runner-up Oregon State, on Saturday morning on the OSC courts. Beaver ace Jimmie Jackson meets Don Flye of Washington in feature match.

5. Northern division dual golf finale at the Corvallis Country club Friday, with Washington favored to defeat Oregon State.

All told, it means well over 600 athletes—both high school and college—seen in action at Oregon State this week end in a mass invasion of the campus.

Medford and Redmond, respective A-1 and A-2 track champions last year, again brought strong clubs to Corvallis. The Black Tornado has won four straight titles, 12 in the last 17 years and have finished first eight out of the last nine times.

Observers believed at least 20 cars will attempt to qualify for the Memorial Day classic Saturday and Sunday. The trials close May 26, and the fastest 33 cars make up the field.

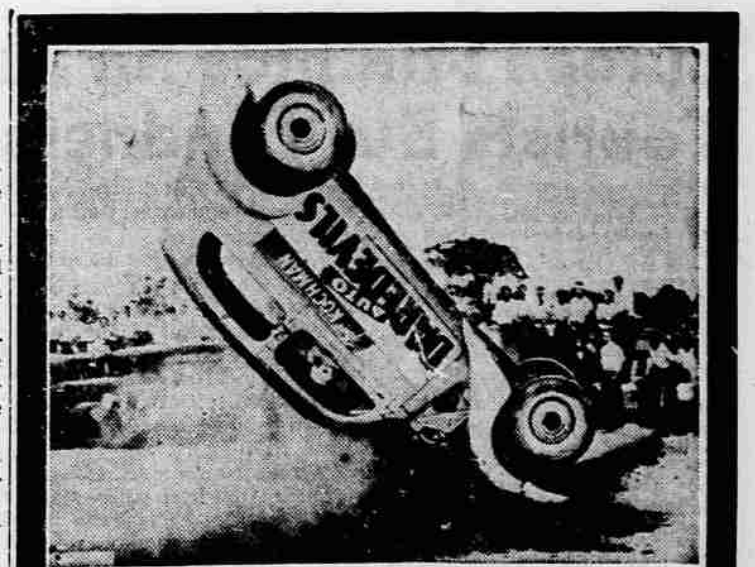

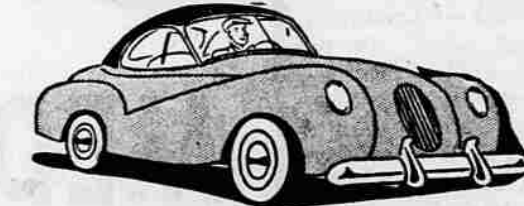
