Fund Distribution Bill Passes Senate

Salem—The Oregon Senate Thursday adopted the compromise report on Senate Bill 64, providing for a new system of distributing state basic school support funds, and then re-passed the measure with only three dissenting votes.

The amended measure was then sent over to the House where action on re-passage was expected this afternoon. The House put measures at the foot of its calendar to hike the basic school support from \$80 per census child to \$95 and providing building programs for the state system of higher education and the state board of control so that it could act first on re-passage of Senate bill 64.
