Experts in Arthritis Can Come To Your Door

The Arthritis and Rheumatism Foundation (23 West 45th st., New York 36, N.Y.) is now sending out to homes of arthritic patients units consisting of a station wagon or panel truck containing apparatus for physical therapy and a manned

With each mobile unit there go into a patient's home physical therapists who not only treat the patient, but instruct members of the family in carrying on the treatments. It helps tremendously to teach the crippled patient how to help himself as much as possible—how to get in and out of a tub, and how to get into and out of a wheel chair. Some members of the family must be taught to help, because unless the patient's exercises and heart treatments are given several times a day, he (or she) is not likely to get much relief.

During the course of the new type of treatment, the arthritic person remains under the supervision of his physician. Whenever possible the patient is quickly gotten up, and back to some form of gainful employment. There are local offices

of the Arthritis and Rheumatism Foundation in a number of the big cities of this country. Unlocked Ward In Mental Hospitals

There has been a great tendency to unlock many of the doors of mental hospitals. It makes the patients feel so much better. They don't feel so much like criminals. It is true that some of them occasionally will go A.W.O.L. but generally a nurse soon catches up with them in a bar, and after a chat they consent to go back to the hospital. When doors are left open, many of the patients behave better because they feel they are being trusted, and they react well to that trust. I read now that today from 30 to 50 percent of the mental wards in Veterans Administration Hospitals are left unlocked.

Naturally, some wards have to be locked because some of the insane, if set free, would be dangerous to their fellows and to themselves.
