He said any amount of rain will damage hay that is cut but still in the fields. One inch of moisture destroys one-third of the nutritional value in hay.

Jossy pointed out that hay is still unable for feed purposes despite moisture. However, excessive moisture can destroy value of hay other than for fertilizer purposes.

Ivan Hale of Shady Cove attended the funeral of his uncle in Grants Pass on Tuesday.

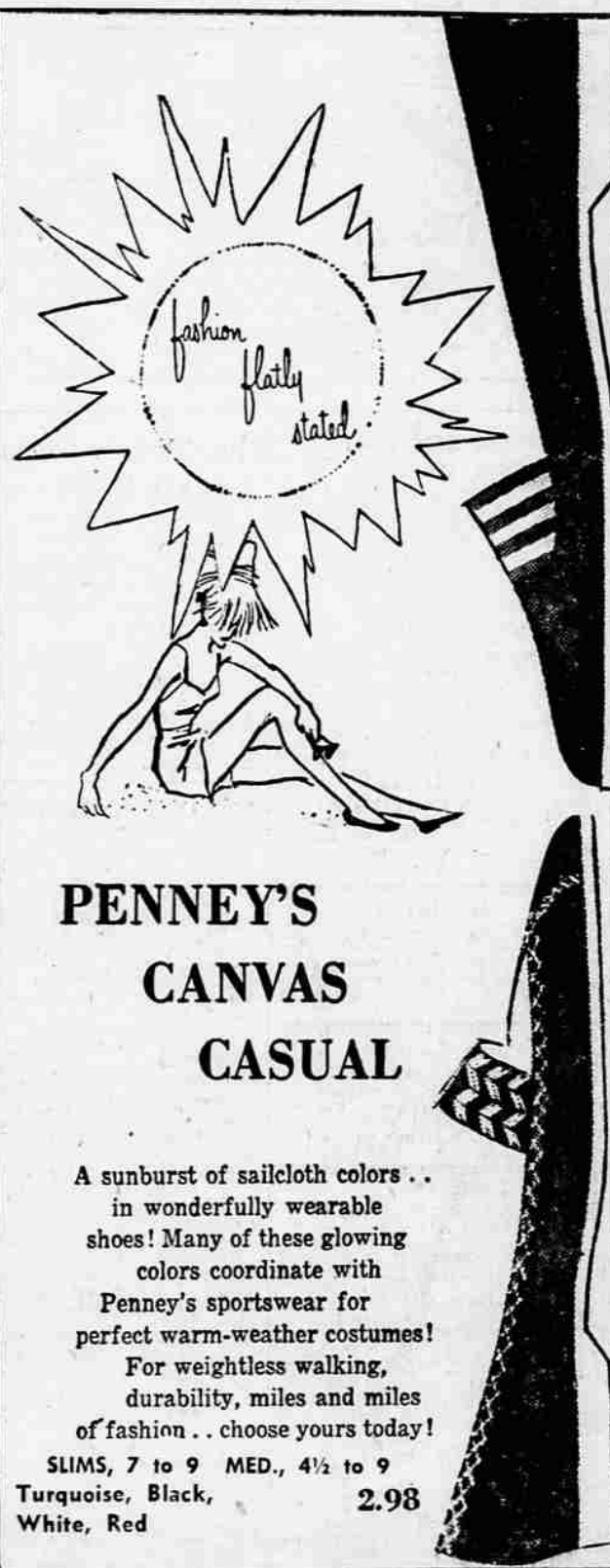
Curt Langston is living again in Shady Cove and is again employed by Trail Creek Lumber company, after spending a year in Denver.

The next meeting will be a potluck dinner on Monday evening, June 10, with the dinner at 7:00 p.m. Husbands and families of members are invited to attend.

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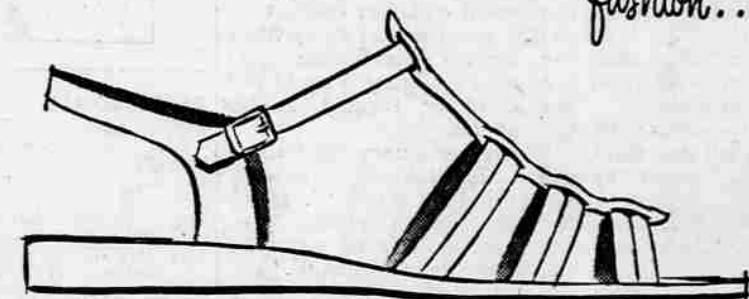
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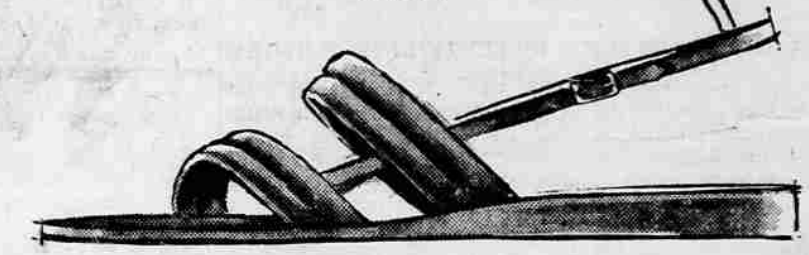
