

Fight Monopoly Hearing May Become More Bitter

New York — The judge told attorneys for both sides to "leave your boxing gloves home" when they resume arguments at next Wednesday's continuation of the fight-monopoly hearing in federal court, but the battle is expected to be increasingly bitter.

Lawrence Gochberg, a vigorous young attorney for the Anti-Trust Division of the Department of Justice, charges that lawyers for Jim Norris and his boxing enterprises are "trying to undermine the findings" of Judge Sylvester Ryan.
