Miss Cooper is a daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Edward Cooper of Camp White and Medford, and Mrs. Cooper left by plane Saturday to attend graduation exercises. She will remain in the east for three weeks.

Miss Cooper, who is majoring in psychology, graduated from Grant Pass High school and has held a Mount Holyoke college scholarship since her freshman year and the Helen E. True scholarship during her junior and senior years. She won the American Field Service trip abroad in the summer of 1953. In her freshman year she received the Charles Cooley award and the Elks award. Miss Cooper was named a Sarah Williston scholar, an honor given for academic excellence during the first four semesters at Mount Holyoke.

While at Mount Holyoke Miss Cooper did both independent and honor work in her major. Her paper, "The Visual Discrimination of Simultaneity and Succession," is in the field of psychophysics and is the result of data she collected from experiments with students.

Miss Cooper is a member of St. Mark's Episcopal church in Medford. At college she served as secretary of the Fellowship of Faiths during her sophomore years, as vice-president of the organization in her junior year, and this year as its president. The Fellowship of Faiths is the campus inter-faith organization.

She has served two years of a three year term as youth delegate to the General Board of the National Council of Churches, representing the national division of Christian Life and Work. The board is the policy making organ of the National council.

During the summer Miss Cooper will work on a psychology project on the staff of Mount Holyoke college.

Henry Steele Commager, American history professor of American studies, and Miss Susan Long a senior class member, will be commencement speakers.

Mrs. Cooper will visit in Boston and New York City before returning to the valley.
