She spoke of the workshop sessions, an unusual Basque dinner at the Basque center, where delegates were entertained by Basque dancers and musicians; an international luncheon, highlighted by a talk made by one of the Altrusa grants-in-aid scholars, Miss Masui Utsumi, Korea; and a speech by Miss Marjorie Lamb, international president from Toronto, Canada, on "Altrusa and the World Around Us."

In her convention address, Miss Lamb said that voluntary organizations are assuming an ever-increasing importance in democratic countries, with corresponding responsibilities. Miss Lamb said she believed this to be right and added "voluntary association of free men and women is the most characteristic manifestation of the free world. In those parts of the world where freedom is extinct, voluntary organizations cannot exist. But in our democratic society, service clubs, for example, are a tremendous force of good within our civic, national and international structure. One of the reasons they are such a healthy force is that each member remains an individual, free and complete, voluntarily submitting within certain areas only, to be governed by an agreed constitution and by-laws."

A memorial service was held for our Altrusans who had died during the last year. Mrs. Rankin took part in this ceremony, which honored the memory of Mrs. Marjorie Butler, the local club's second president.
