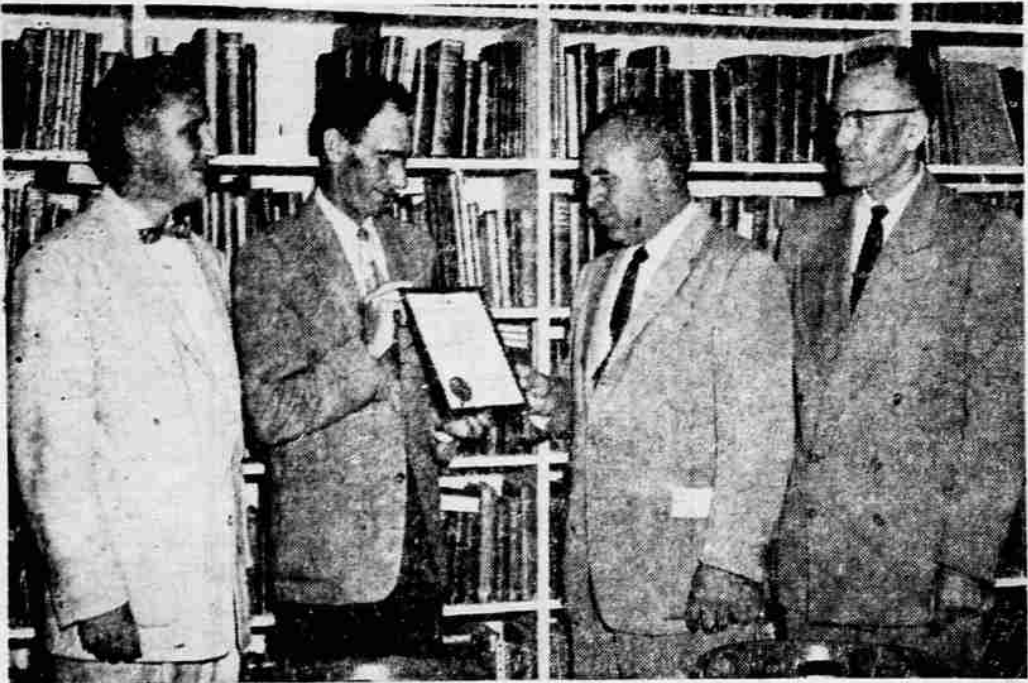

An Israeli tractor driver was killed Wednesday and another farmer wounded seriously in the explosion of a land mine laid during the night by infiltrators from the Gaza Strip, an Israeli military spokesman announced in Jerusalem.

The explosion occurred on the outskirts of the village of Kissufim, near the Gaza border, while the tractor was taking dayshift workers to the fields. The tractor passed safely over the same dirt road Tuesday night, and police said infiltrators had entered the area since then.



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
