Plans are being formulated for the second annual musical soiree to be held later this summer. All members and everyone else interested in helping to bring more fine music into the community are invited to attend.

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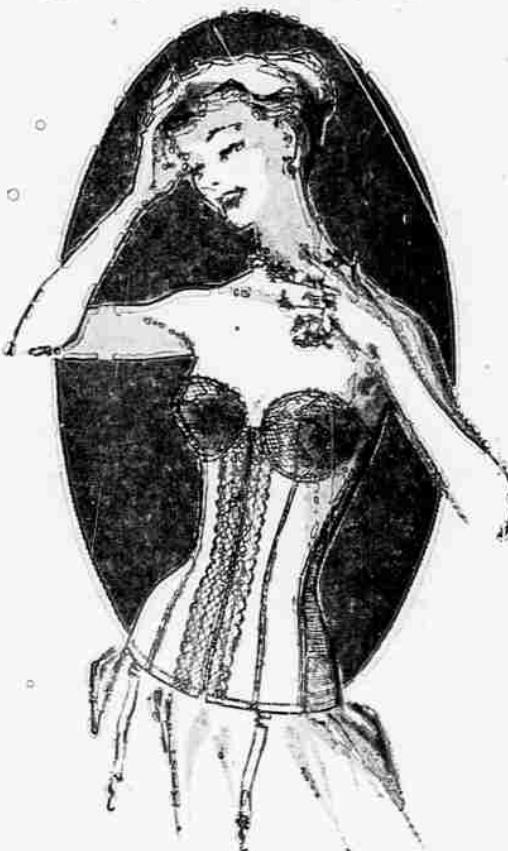
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
