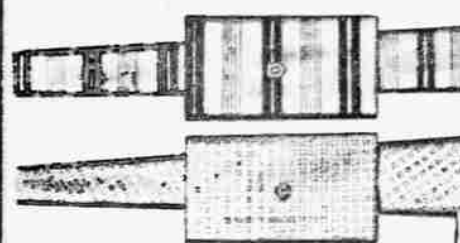

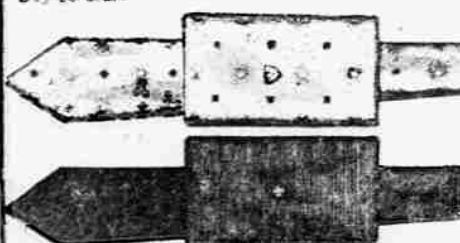

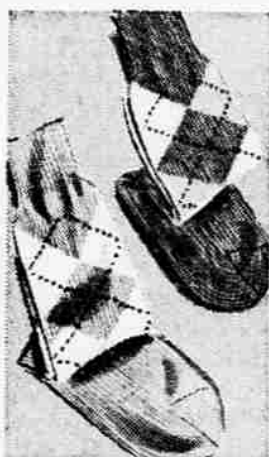

Speakers Named For Convention Of Eagles Here

Four prominent leaders of the
Fraternal Order of Eagles will
represent the grand aerie and
address the convention of the
Oregon state aerie, at Medford,
June 27-29, it was announced
Friday.

The visitors will be Ralph
Goodman, Vancouver, B.C.,
Northwest regional president,
representing the membership
department; Judge Robert W.
Hansen, Milwaukee, Wis.,
chairman of the program and
activities department; Michael
T. Gaffney, Milwaukee, Wis.,
financial adviser, representing
the program and activities de-
partment; and Grand Worthy
President Lawrence Leahy, We-
natchee, Wash.

Action Planned

Measures to advance current
Eagle programs and activities
are expected to be taken at the
convention. Among these is a
nationwide campaign by the
Eagles for "Jobs Over 40" to
and legislation which will elim-
inate discrimination because of
age. Another is the "Peoples-to-
Peoples" program by the Eagles
to establish better understand-
ing among nations, which in-
cludes the donation of "Truth
Libraries" by aeries and auxil-
iaries to communities in foreign
countries to acquaint them with
the American way of life, and
Eaglehaus in West Berlin, Ger-
many, a vocational school pro-
ject for German youth set up by
the Eagles in co-operation with
CARE and the German govern-
ment.

Continued support of the Da-
mon Runyon cancer fund cam-
paign each year by aeries and
auxiliaries, and support of the
Eagles Memorial Foundation, a
trust fund to provide physical
welfare services and college ed-
ucations for the children of
Eagles who lost their lives in
military service, are expected
to be voted.

Youth guidance programs to
combat juvenile delinquency,
and aid for the handicapped,
community safety campaigns
and Crusade for Freedom bal-
loon launchings by aeries are
expected to be bolstered by
state convention.

Holy Land Travel Held To Be Safe

Rome—Travel in the Holy
Land is as safe as it ever was
despite current unrest in the
Middle East, an American Roman
Catholic priest has reported.

The Rev. Pius Barth, overseer
of the Franciscan Middle West
Province, arrived here Thursday
from an inspection tour of the
area's shrines and holy sites.

Father Barth, who makes his
headquarters at the Saint An-
thony Priory in St. Louis, Mo.,
said little of the Middle East
tensions has rubbed off on the
holy places. Pilgrims can move
about with relative freedom and
security.

He said the most disturbing
result of the tensions has been
the almost total lack of pilgrims
in the last eight months and the
resulting economic strangulation
of Holy Land sites.
