

Deadline of July 7 Decreed for Moore

Grand Rapids, Mich. — Archie Moore, who has successfully avoided defending his light-heavyweight crown for a year, was slapped with a suspension today by National Boxing Association President Floyd Stevens.

Stevens said that Moore now must defend the title by July 7 or it will be vacated by the NBA.

"And I don't mean just sign for a defense by July 7," Stevens said. "We're going through with our decision of a month ago."

At that time Moore was given an additional period to pare the pounds from his 200-plus frame to the 175-pound light heavy limit. Moore has been in Ger-

Portland — Athletes from Portland colleges will dominate the list of Oregon entries in the annual National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics track and field meet today and Saturday in San Diego.

In the discus and javelin events will be two Lewis and Clark college weightmen. Loren Michelson was fourth in the discus last year and Joe Boutin was fifth in the javelin. Jim Clayton will also hurl the javelin for Lewis & Clark and Bob Mitchell will be entered in the two-mile.

Len Lukens, another two-miler from Portland State college is entered along with Mitchell. From Linfield college at McMinnville will be Bill Machamer, 449-yard; Howard Glenn, shot put, and Hiram Crane in the javelin.

Members of the SOA notified officials of the local harness racing track Thursday that if their demands are not reached they will not enter horses for next Friday's program. Entries for that day normally would be made next Monday morning.

The horsemen have asked that their share of the purses be increased from 35 to 45 per cent of the track's percentage.

Tryouts For State Rifle, Pistol Team This Sunday at Clackamas

Portland — The office of the Adjutant General of the State of Oregon has transmitted to the Oregon State Rifle and Pistol association an order stating that they shall choose a team from the citizens of the state to represent Oregon in the national matches at Camp Perry, Ohio, from August 9 through September 19.

The team is to consist of 10 men and to be either high power rifle, fired with a M-1 service rifle, or pistol, fired with a .45 caliber service automatic or a combination of the two.

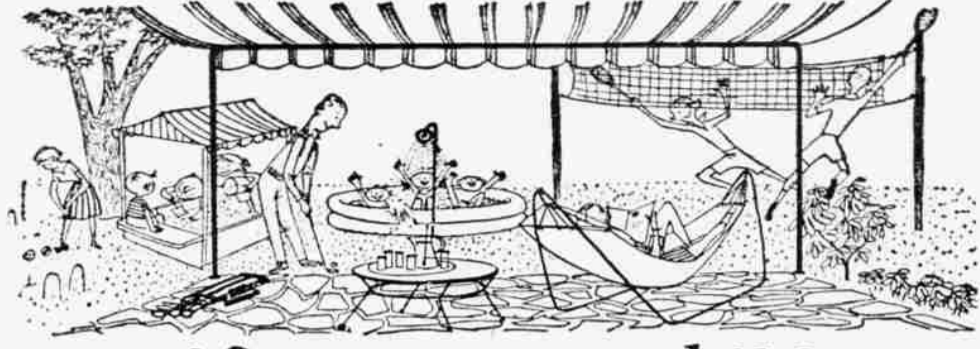
It is expected that the government will defray the cost of the team to the extent of 5c per mile and \$1.50 per day, per team member.

Pistol shooters may report to the range any time after 8 a.m., with firing to start at 9 a.m. and to continue until all applicants possible have been allowed to fire.
