Not so this time because there is a new ingredient added—inflation. Investors are wary about investing in bonds because of this inflation factor.

Stocks and Bonds Getting in Line as Media of Investment

vestors in the lowest tax brackets of 20 per cent can get a better yield after taxes in a typical municipal bond than from savings bonds, savings and loan shares, or savings bank deposits, according to Prentice-Hall.

Tax exempts aren't popular with the little fellow, though. He just doesn't know much about the over-the-counter market where they are traded.

There's a bill before Congress that might help the municipal market, it is pointed out. It would permit mutual funds or closed-end investment companies with 95 per cent or more of their assets in municipals to pass on the tax exemption on such bonds to their shareholders.

Entry of investment companies into this field could well tip the inventory of municipals on the shelves. The overall result would be a cut in the floating supply, higher prices and lower yields on the issues.

Atomic Test Blast Hoped for Tomorrow

Las Vegas, Nev. — The Atomic Energy commission today hoped that weather conditions would improve sufficiently to set off the much-postponed fourth nuclear blast of the summer test series tomorrow at 3:45 a.m. (PST).

The AEC was forced to call off the detonation scheduled today because of strong surface winds at the Yucca Flat test site, 75 miles northwest of here. It was the sixth time the blast was postponed another 24 hours.

The fourth test is expected to be the detonation of a nuclear device suspended under a balloon 500 feet above the desert. The AEC said the fallout from the explosion will be confined to the test area.
