Taxes Causing Exodus Of Investment Money, Speaker Tells Rotary

Because of the tax situation in Oregon, there is already an exodus of investment capital from this state. This view was voiced by Louise Humphrey, executive assistant of Oregon Tax research, in a luncheon address Tuesday before the Medford Rotary club.

Speaking at the Jackson hotel, Mrs. Humphrey reminded Rotarians that the governor and the majority party in the last legislature made it clear that Oregon must rely upon personal income and business taxes to finance the major portion of its governmental costs.

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Greek Treatise on Minerals Translated

The book includes the Greek text, a translation and a detailed commentary on the original work, "On Stones," by Theophrastus, (372-287 B.C.) a philosopher and pupil of Aristotle.
