The guests left Thursday by the Redwoods highway and the coast route for California.

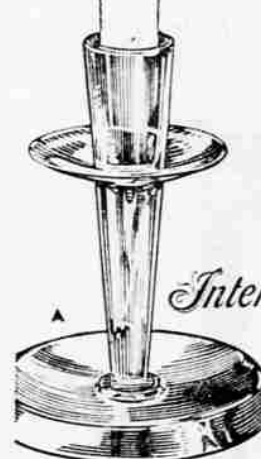
Married
