Cost of Living Expected To Set Record Tuesday

Washington — The cost of living is expected to set an all-time record Tuesday for the ninth month in a row when the government's consumer price index for May is slated to come out.

Government officials predict it will show another rise from the record set in April, making the ninth successive month living costs have broken all previous records.

The expected new peak will bring with it pay raises of at least 3 to 4 cent an hour for 300,000 workers and possibly smaller boosts for 100,000 more. These are persons whose union wage contracts contain "escalator" clauses providing for raises or pay cuts as the government price index rises or falls.

The consumer price index rose in April to 119.3 per cent of the 1947-49 price average, which is used as a basis for comparison. That is an overall price rise of almost 20 per cent in the past 8-10 years.

Federal experts agree generally with predictions of U.S. Chamber of Commerce officials that prices will continue to rise through the rest of this year, though probably not as rapidly as during the last half of 1956.

The current upward push in living costs began around April, 1956. The biggest increases since then have been in autos and auto repairs, despite discounts on new cars; public transportation fares; household fuels with the Suez Canal oil crisis a factor; meats, poultry and fish; cereals and bakery products; dairy products; medical care costs; household operations costs, with laundry and dry cleaning and other service charges important; shoes; personal care, particular haircuts; and reading and recreation.

Hell Necessary, Graham Declares

New York — Evangelist Billy Graham said Sunday night Hell is necessary to keep man from sin as the electric chair is necessary as a deterrent to murder.

Graham discussed his concept of hell before some 18,300 persons in Madison Square Garden. The North Carolina preacher said he did not know what hell was like "but I know the word fire is used figuratively in the Bible."

"I took my degree in college anthropology," he said. "We never did find a tribe in the world that did not believe in God and redemption. Hell is needed to restrain man from sin—take away the fear of jails and electric chairs and New York would become a hell overnight. Let the gangsters into heaven and they'd make a pig pen out of it."

Graham said God does not send you to hell. He offers a way of salvation but that each individual selected his own road. He warned that those attending his crusade had a chance for redemption if they did not wait too long.

"One minute after death and it'll be too late," Graham said. "For many the death bed will be too late."

"Many ministers have distorted the concept of hell," he said. "Others have taken the Bible apart and fixed it to agree with their own notions."

Alcorn Says Civil Rights Sold Out for Votes on Hells Canyon

Washington — Republican National Chairman Meade Alcorn charged Sunday that six "self-styled liberal Democrats" sold out civil rights in the Senate last week to win southern Democratic support for the Hells Canyon dam bill.

Sen. Mike Mansfield (D-Mont.) Senate Democratic whip and acting majority leader, promptly denied the charge. He said there was "no deal of any kind, sort or nature and there were no trades on the part of any Democrat with any other Democrat for votes."

Those accused by Alcorn of having made "a deal to swap off civil rights for Hells Canyon" were Sens. Wayne Morse (D-Ore.), John F. Kennedy (D-Mass.), Warren G. Magnuson (D-Wash.), James E. Murray (D-Mont.), Joseph C. O'Mahoney (D-Wyo.) and Mansfield.

Alcorn said the "band of self-styled liberal Democrats who have been hoodwinking minority groups for years showed their true colors" when they backed a move to send the civil rights bill to the Senate Judiciary Committee which has bottled up civil rights legislation.

The move was defeated Thursday, 45 to 39. A move will be made sometime after July 8 to bring the civil rights bill up for vote. Sen. Allen J. Ellender (D-La.) has warned that the move will be met with a southern filibuster.

Alcorn noted in a statement that the day after the civil rights vote the Senate passed a Democratic-sponsored bill to build a government-financed high dam in the Hells Canyon region of the Snake river.

He recalled that all of the Democrats he named, except Kennedy, were sponsors of the Hells Canyon bill.

"I am quite certain they, like the Democrats, did not enter into any deal of any kind with anyone," he said.

Truck Driver Wins \$16,000 in Quiz

New York — A Los Angeles truck driver, who missed a television quiz jackpot question earlier this year, won \$16,000 Sunday night on "The \$64,000 Challenge 55."

Al Einfrank, who lost his relatives, friends and nearly his wife when he missed the top question on "The \$64,000 Question" last January, partially redeemed himself on his sister show by defeating his challenger in a geography category.

The contestants played under new rules in which the challenger and champion each are required to rule on whether an opponent's answers are correct. They are eliminated either by answering a question incorrectly or failing to recognize an incorrect answer by the opponent.

In another match, jockey Billy Pearson, Pasadena, Calif., tied with Mrs. Jane Wilson, a New York City housewife, model and artist, at \$6,000 in a Renaissance art category.

In a third match, 11-year-old Robert Strom, who won \$192,000 on the "Question" tied at the \$1,000 level with another 11-year-old science expert, David Junchen of Sherrard, Ill.
