## The Medical Roundup

### Hepatitis, or Inflammation of the Liver

Scores of persons ask what to do for hepatitis, or inflammation of the liver. So far as I can find out, there is very little that can be done. Hepatitis is due to a virus, or perhaps several viruses that cause more or less injury to the liver. Fortunately, in most cases, the injury is not great, and after a while the disease clears up, leaving a normal liver. Only in rare cases is the liver so badly damaged that the man is thereafter handicapped, or has what is called cirrhosis or a hardening and shrinkage of the liver. There is a type of cirrhosis of the liver in which the cause is the drinking of too much alcohol.

For years I have been reading articles on the treatment of hepatitis, and the impression I have gotten is that there is no medicine that can be counted on to help, and there is no special diet worth prescribing. In the army, the doctors decided that

the affected soldier did best on a full, adequate diet. Some doctors, for a while, thought it would be best to keep the patient with hepatitis in bed, but in the army it was found that this did not pay. The soldiers who were gotten up quickly and allowed to get about got well somewhat faster than did those who were kept in bed.

The important point is that in the majority of cases hepatitis clears up by itself, leaving a liver that isn't damaged enough so that one can detect the injury. Fortunately, the liver is much like a lizard's tail—it has great powers of regeneration. Fortunately, also, the Designer put much more liver into us than we absolutely need. In a dog one can remove surgically six-sevenths of the liver without impairing the animal's health.

There are two main types of anemia: one—the common one—the so-called secondary anemia, is due to a loss of blood from the body. Some women menstruate so heavily every month that, during the interval they cannot build back all of the blood they have lost. Some people get a secondary anemia from severe bleeding from piles; and many, of course, in their later years, get a severe anemia because of the oozing of blood from a cancer in the bowel or stomach. No one should treat a secondary anemia until he has a good idea where the person is losing blood. For this type of anemia the drug need is some preparation of iron. Liver and Vitamin B12 are not indicated.

The pernicious, or primary type of anemia, is due to some hereditary disturbance of the body chemistry. Usually an expert can tell which type of anemia he is dealing with from one glance at the stained smears of the blood on a glass slide. People with pernicious anemia often get gray by the time they are 25; they have almost no gastric juice, and no free acid in this juice. Some have numbness and tingling in their legs, and then, if they do not quickly find out what is wrong and get treatment with Vitamin B12, they can get into serious difficulty in walking. The patient with pernicious anemia must keep taking treatment at intervals for the rest of his days.
